## A BILL

To provide adequate school facilities within Yosemite National Park, and for other purposes.

1	Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-				
2	tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,				
3	SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.				
4	This Act may be cited as the "Yosemite National Park				
5	Education Improvement Act".				
6	SEC. 2. FINDINGS AND PURPOSE.				
7	(a) FINDINGS.—Congress finds the following:				
8	(1) The three elementary schools serving the chil-				
9	dren of employees of Yosemite National Park are				
10	served by the Bass Lake Joint Union Elementary				
11	School District and the Mariposa Unified School Dis-				
12	trict.				
13	(2) The schools are in remote mountainous areas				
14	and long distances from other educational and ad-				
15	ministrative facilities of the two local educational				
16	agencies.				
17	(3) Because of their remote locations and rel-				
18	atively small number of students, schools serving the				
19	children of employees of the Park provide fewer serv-				
20	ices in more basic facilities than the educational serv-				

- ices and facilities provided to students that attend
   other schools served by the two local educational agen cies.
- 4 (4) Because of the long distances involved and 5 adverse weather and road conditions that occur dur-6 ing much of the school year, it is impractical for the 7 children of employees of the Park who live within or 8 near the Park to attend other schools served by the 9 two local educational agencies.
- 10 (b) PURPOSE.—The purpose of this Act is to authorize 11 the Secretary of the Interior to provide supplemental fund-12 ing and other services that are necessary to assist the State 13 of California or local educational agencies in California in 14 providing educational services for students attending 15 schools located within the Park.

#### 16 SEC. 3. PAYMENTS FOR EDUCATIONAL SERVICES.

17 (a) AUTHORITY TO PROVIDE FUNDS.—For fiscal years
18 2003 through 2007, the Secretary may provide funds to the
19 Bass Lake Joint Union Elementary School District and the
20 Mariposa Unified School District for educational services
21 to students who are dependents of persons engaged in the
22 administration, operation, and maintenance of the Park or
23 students who live at or near the Park upon real property
24 of the United States.

1 (b) Limitation on Use of Funds.—Payments made by the Secretary under this section may not be used for new construction, construction contracts, or major capital 3 4 improvements, and may be used only to pay public employees for services otherwise authorized by this Act. 5 6 (c) Limitation on Amount of Funds.—Payments made under this section shall not exceed the lesser of 8 \$750,000 in any fiscal year or the amount necessary to provide students described in subsection (a) with educational 10 services that are normally provided and generally available to students who attend public schools elsewhere in the State 12 of California. 13 (d) Adjustment of Payments.—Subject to subsection (c), the Secretary is authorized to adjust payments 14 15 made under this section if the State of California or the appropriate local educational agencies do not continue to 16 provide funding for educational services at Park schools at per student levels that are equivalent to or greater than those provided in the fiscal year prior to the date of enact-19 20 ment of this Act. 21 (e) Source of Payments.— 22 (1) AUTHORIZED SOURCES.—Except as provided 23 in paragraph (2), in order to make payments under 24 this section, the Secretary may use funds available to

3	(2) Exceptions.—Funds from the following					
4	sources may not be used to make payments under this					
5	section:					
6	(A) Fees authorized and collected under the					
7	Land and Water Conservation Fund Act of 196					
8	(16 U.S.C. 460l-4 et seq.).					
9	(B) The recreational fee demonstration pro-					
10	gram under section 315 of the Department of the					
11	Interior and Related Agencies Appropriations					
12	Act, 1996 (as contained in section 101(c) of Pub-					
13	lic Law 104–134; 16 U.S.C. 460l–6a note).					
14	(C) The national park passport program es-					
15	tablished under section 602 of the National					
16	Parks Omnibus Management Act of 1998 (16					
17	U.S.C. 5992).					
18	(D) Emergency appropriations for Yosemite					
19	flood recovery.					
20	(f) Definitions.—For the purposes of this Act, the fol-					
21	lowing definitions apply:					
22	(1) Local educational agencies.—The term					
23	"local educational agencies" has the meaning given					
24	that term in section 9101(26) of the Elementary and					
25	Secondary Education Act of 1965.					

1	(2) Educational Services.—The term "edu-					
2	cational services" means services that may include					
3	maintenance and minor upgrades of facilities and					
4	transportation to and from school.					
5	(3) PARK.—The term "Park" means Yosemite					
6	National Park.					
7	(4) Secretary.—The term "Secretary" means					
8	the Secretary of the Interior.					

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
