A BILL

- To provide for the competitive operation of the Northeast rail corridor and Autotrain using State and private sector initiatives.
 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
 - 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
 - 4 This Act may be cited as the "Systemic Passenger
 - 5 Infrastructure and Network Overhaul through Financial
 - 6 Freedom Act".
 - 7 SEC. 2. INTERIM DIRECTED SERVICE.
 - 8 (a) Transfer of Ownership.—Effective on the
 - 9 date of the enactment of this Act—

- 1 (1) title to all property of the National Railroad 2 Passenger Corporation necessary for the operation 3 of the main line of the Northeast Corridor between 4 the District of Columbia and Boston, Massachusetts, 5 and the Autotrain shall transfer to the Secretary of
- 7 (2) the note and mortgage described in section 8 24907 of title 49, United States Code, is canceled, 9 in consideration for the transfer described in para-10 graph (1).

Transportation; and

- 11 (b) Interim Operations.—The Secretary of Trans12 portation shall ensure the continuation of maintenance
 13 and dispatching of service on the main line of the North14 east Corridor between the District of Columbia and Bos15 ton, Massachusetts, and of the Autotrain, until directed
 16 service is initiated under subsection (c). The Secretary is
 17 authorized to use personnel of the National Railroad Pas18 senger Corporation to carry out this subsection.
- 19 (c) DIRECTED SERVICE.—Not later than 3 months 20 after the date of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary 21 of Transportation shall complete a competitive selection 22 of an entity or entities to maintain and dispatch service 23 on the main line of the Northeast Corridor between the 24 District of Columbia and Boston, Massachusetts, and for 25 the Autotrain, and shall take such actions as are necessary

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- 1 to initiate and maintain such directed service until the dis-
- 2 position of such operations pursuant to sections 3 and 4,
- 3 and for such additional time as is necessary to ensure the
- 4 orderly transition of operations under those sections. In
- 5 carrying out this subsection, the Secretary and any entity
- 6 or entities selected by the Secretary shall have the powers
- 7 and authorities, including access rights, of the National
- 8 Railroad Passenger Corporation with respect to the service
- 9 involved.

10 SEC. 3. NORTHEAST CORRIDOR.

- 11 (a) Comptroller General Analysis.—Not later
- 12 than 1 year after the date of the enactment of this Act,
- 13 the Comptroller General shall transmit to the Secretary
- 14 of Transportation a report analyzing the capital require-
- 15 ments needed to ensure that the Northeast Corridor can
- 16 be operated in a financially viable manner.
- 17 (b) Determination of Appropriate Disposi-
- 18 TION.—Not later than 2 years after the date of the enact-
- 19 ment of this Act, the Secretary, after considering the pros-
- 20 pects of financial viability, including capital requirements
- 21 as reported under subsection (a) and proposed financing
- 22 options, shall determine which of the following options is
- 23 most appropriate for the disposition of the operations (and
- 24 all necessary supporting property) described in section
- 25 2(b) and (c) with respect to the Northeast Corridor:

- 1 (1) Transfer of such operations to an interstate 2 compact, entered into under section 410 of the Am-3 trak Reform and Accountability Act of 1997, con-4 sisting of the States of the Northeast Corridor.
- 5 (2) Transfer of such operations to a new quasi-6 governmental corporation or to a private sector cor-7 poration.
- 8 (3) Retention of ownership by the Secretary of 9 Transportation, with competitive franchising, by 1 10 or more entities, of the management and dispatching 11 of service.
- 12 The Secretary shall transmit to the Congress a report on
- 13 the determination made under this subsection.
- 14 (c) IMPLEMENTATION.—Not later than 6 months
- 15 after a determination is made under subsection (b), the
- 16 Secretary shall implement the appropriate disposition as
- 17 so determined.
- 18 SEC. 4. AUTOTRAIN.
- 19 (a) Determination of Appropriate Disposi-
- 20 TION.—Not later than 1 year after the date of the enact-
- 21 ment of this Act, the Secretary, after considering the pros-
- 22 pects of financial viability, including capital requirements
- 23 and proposed financing options, shall determine which of
- 24 the following options is most appropriate for the disposi-
- 25 tion of the operations (and all necessary supporting prop-

- 1 erty) described in section 2(b) with respect to the Auto-
- 2 train:
- 3 (1) Transfer of such operations to a new quasi-
- 4 governmental corporation or to a private sector cor-
- 5 poration.
- 6 (2) Retention of ownership by the Secretary of
- 7 Transportation, with competitive franchising, by 1
- 8 or more entities, of the management and operations.
- 9 The Secretary shall transmit to the Congress a report on
- 10 the determination made under this subsection.
- 11 (b) Implementation.—Not later than 6 months
- 12 after a determination is made under subsection (a), the
- 13 Secretary shall implement the appropriate disposition as
- 14 so determined.
- 15 SEC. 5. FUNDING.
- 16 (a) RETENTION OF AMOUNTS.—The Secretary of
- 17 Transportation shall retain all amounts appropriated by
- 18 the Federal Government for fiscal year 2002 for the Na-
- 19 tional Railroad Passenger Corporation that have not been
- 20 provided to the National Railroad Passenger Corporation,
- 21 and such amounts shall be available to the Secretary for
- 22 carrying out this Act.
- 23 (b) Transfer of Amounts.—The National Rail-
- 24 road Passenger Corporation shall transfer to the Secretary
- 25 of Transportation all amounts appropriated by the Fed-

- 1 eral Government for fiscal year 2002 and provided to the
- 2 National Railroad Passenger Corporation, and such
- 3 amounts shall be available to the Secretary for carrying
- 4 out this Act.

5 SEC. 6. NONAPPLICABILITY OF PROVISION.

- 6 A local governmental authority (as defined in section
- 7 5302(a)(6) of title 49, United States Code) shall not be
- 8 subject to any obligation under any arrangement pursuant
- 9 to section 5333(b) of title 49, United States Code, with
- 10 respect to employees of the National Railroad Passenger
- 11 Corporation providing services to such authority pursuant
- 12 to a contract between the authority and the National Rail-
- 13 road Passenger Corporation.

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
