A BILL

To direct the Secretary of the Interior to conduct a special resource study to determine the national significance of the Miami Circle site in the State of Florida and the suitability and feasibility of its inclusion in the National Park System as part of Biscayne National Park, and for other purposes.

1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, 2 3 SECTION 1. FINDINGS AND PURPOSES. 4 (a) FINDINGS.—Congress finds that— 5 (1) the Tequesta Indians were one of the earliest 6 groups to establish permanent villages in southeast 7 Florida: 8 (2) the Tequestas had one of only two North 9 American civilizations that thrived and developed 10 into a complex social chiefdom without an agricul-11 tural base: 12 (3) the Tequesta sites that remain preserved 13 today are rare; 14 (4) the discovery of the Miami Circle, occupied 15 by the Tequesta approximately 2,000 years ago, pre-16 sents a valuable new opportunity to learn more about 17 the Tequesta culture; and 18 (5) Biscayne National Park also contains and 19 protects several prehistoric Tequesta sites. 20 (b) Purpose.—The purpose of this Act is to direct the Secretary to conduct a special resource study to determine 21 the national significance of the Miami Circle site as well

- 3 SEC. 2. DEFINITIONS.
- 4 In this Act:
- 5 (1) Miami circle.—The term "Miami Circle"
- 6 means the Miami Circle archaeological site in Miami-
- 7 Dade County, Florida.
- 8 (2) PARK.—The term "Park" means Biscayne
- 9 National Park in the State of Florida.
- 10 (3) Secretary.—The term "Secretary" means
- 11 the Secretary of the Interior, acting through the Di-
- 12 rector of the National Park Service.
- 13 SEC. 3. SPECIAL RESOURCE STUDY.
- 14 (a) In General.—Not later than 3 years after the
- 15 date funds are made available, the Secretary shall conduct
- 16 a special resource study as described in subsection (b). In
- 17 conducting the study, the Secretary shall consult with the
- 18 appropriate American Indian tribes and other interested
- 19 groups and organizations.
- 20 (b) Components.—In addition to a determination of
- 21 national significance, feasibility, and suitability, the spe-
- 22 cial resource study shall include the analysis and rec-
- 23 ommendations of the Secretary with respect to—

1	(1) which, if any, particular areas of or sur-				
2	rounding the Miami Circle should be included in the				
3	Park;				
4	(2) whether any additional staff, facilities, or				
5	other resources would be necessary to administer the				
6	Miami Circle as a unit of the Park; and				
7	(3) any impact on the local area that would re-				
8	sult from the inclusion of Miami Circle in the Pe				
9	(c) Report.—Not later than 30 days after completion				
10	of the study, the Secretary shall submit a report describing				
11	the findings and recommendations of the study to the Com				
12	mittee on Energy and Natural Resources of the Senate and				
13	the Committee on Resources of the United States House of				
14	Representatives.				
15	(d) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—There are				
16	authorized to be appropriated such sums as are necessary				
17	to carry out this Act.
