3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Homeland Security5 Fund Act of 2002".

14 "(a) IN GENERAL.—Every taxpayer whose adjusted
15 income tax liability for the taxable year is \$3 or more may
16 designate that \$3 be paid over to the Homeland Security
17 Fund.

18 "(b) MANNER AND TIME OF DESIGNATION.—A des19 ignation under subsection (a) may be made with respect
20 to any taxable year—

21 "(1) at the time of filing the return of the tax22 imposed by chapter 1 for such taxable year, or

23 "(2) at any other time (after the time of filing24 the return of the tax imposed by chapter 1 for such

taxable year) specified in regulations prescribed by
 the Secretary.

3 Such designation shall be made in such manner as the
4 Secretary prescribes by regulations except that, if such
5 designation is made at the time of filing the return of the
6 tax imposed by chapter 1 for such taxable year, such des7 ignation shall be made either on the first page of the re8 turn or on the page bearing the taxpayer's signature.

9 "(c) Special Rules.—

10 "(1) DESIGNATION OF INCOME TAX LIABIL-11 ITY.—

"(A) JOINT RETURNS.—In the case of a
joint return having an adjusted income tax liability of \$6 or more, each spouse may designate that \$3 be paid over to the Homeland
Security Fund.

17 "(B) ADJUSTED INCOME TAX LIABILITY.—
18 For purposes of this section, the term 'adjusted
19 income tax liability' means income tax liability
20 (as defined in section 6096(b)) reduced by any
21 amount designated under section 6096 (relating

(b) CLERICAL AMENDMENT.—The table of parts for

5 this section shall apply to taxable years ending after the
6 date of the enactment of this Act.

7 SEC. 102. HOMELAND SECURITY FUND.

8 (a) IN GENERAL.—Subchapter A of chapter 98 of the 9 Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (relating to trust fund 10 code) is amended by adding at the end the following new 11 section:

12 "SEC. 9511. HOMELAND SECURITY FUND.

"(a) CREATION OF TRUST FUND.—There is established in the Treasury of the United States a trust fund
to be known as the 'Homeland Security Fund', consisting
of such amounts as may be appropriated or credited to
such Trust Fund as provided in this section or section
9602(b).

"(b) TRANSFERS TO TRUST FUND.—There are hereby appropriated to the Homeland Security Fund amounts
equivalent to the amounts designated under section 6097
(relating to designation for homeland security).

23 "(c) EXPENDITURES.—Amounts in the Homeland24 Security Fund shall be available, as provided in appropria-

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1 SEC. 202. DIRECTOR OF HOMELAND SECURITY.

(a) DIRECTOR.—The head of the Office shall be the
Director of the Office of Homeland Security, who shall
be appointed by the President, by and with the advice and
consent of the Senate. The President shall ensure that the
Director functions as a cabinet-level official.

13 SEC. 203. RESPONSIBILITIES.

Subject to the direction and control of the President,the responsibilities of the Director shall include the fol-lowing:

of the President to Congress the relevance and accuracy of counterterrorism budgets from Federal agencies and rejecting budget requests not consistent
with the national homeland security strategy.

18 a comprehensive national assessment on the threat
19 to homeland security, which shall be conducted by
20 the heads of relevant Federal agencies.

(7) Overseeing the appropriate sharing of information among Federal, State, and local agencies involved in intelligence collection and law enforcement
for the purpose of protecting homeland security.

2	analyze and publicize as appropriate lessons learned
3	from homeland security exercises conducted by Fed-
4	eral, State, and local government agencies and other

15	(b) STAFF.—The Director may appoint such employ-

19	local expertise.

21	The Director shall submit to the Congress annual re-
