A BILL

- To authorize the Secretary of the Interior to establish a program to inventory, evaluate, document, and assist efforts to preserve surviving United States Life-Saving Service stations.
 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "United States Life-

5 Saving Service Heritage Act".

6 SEC. 2. FINDINGS AND PURPOSE.

7 (a) FINDINGS.—The Congress finds the following:

1	(1) The United States Life-Saving Service was
2	organized by the Congress by enactment of the Act
3	entitled "An Act to organize the Life-Saving-Serv-
4	ice", approved June 18, 1878 (chapter 265; 20 Stat.
5	163 et seq.).
6	(2) These lifesaving stations were staffed by
7	brave volunteer and professional lifesavers, who
8	risked life and limb to rescue shipwrecked pas-
9	sengers and crews.
10	(3) Many surviving Life-Saving Service stations
11	are of rare architectural significance, yet these his-
12	toric stations are threatened by harsh coastal envi-
13	ronments, rapid economic development in the coastal
14	zone, neglect, and lack of resources for their preser-
15	vation.
16	(4) The heroic actions of Life-Saving Service
17	personnel deserve greater recognition, and their con-
18	tributions to America's maritime history should be
19	celebrated through a comprehensive preservation
20	program and greater opportunities for the public's
21	education about the heritage of the Life-Saving
22	Service.

(b) PURPOSE.—The purpose of this Act is to author-ize the Secretary of the Interior to establish a program

to inventory, evaluate, document, and assist efforts to pre serve surviving Life-Saving Service stations.

3 SEC. 3. UNITED STATES LIFE-SAVING SERVICE STATION 4 PRESERVATION PROGRAM.

5 (a) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary of the Interior,
6 through the National Maritime Initiative of the National
7 Park Service, shall establish a program in accordance with
8 this section to inventory, evaluate, document, and assist
9 efforts to preserve surviving United States Life-Saving
10 Service stations.

(b) INVENTORY, DOCUMENTATION, AND EVALUATION.—The Secretary, in cooperation with the U.S. LifeSaving Service Heritage Association, shall—

14 (1) survey coastal regions of the United States
15 to identify and prepare an inventory of surviving his16 toric lifesaving stations;

17 (2) document the designs of significant existing
18 structures and lifesaving boats of historic lifesaving
19 stations, for inclusion in the Historic American En20 gineering Record Collection; and

21 (3) evaluate historic lifesaving stations,
22 including—

23 (A) assessing the historic significance, in24 tegrity, and condition of surviving historic life25 saving stations; and

1 making recommendations for out-(B) 2 standing examples of historic lifesaving stations 3 that should be designated as National Historic Landmarks. 4 5 (c) TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE, EDUCATIONAL MATE-RIALS, RESEARCH AIDS, AND OTHER INFORMATION.-6 7 The Secretary shall— 8 (1) serve as a clearinghouse of information for 9 persons interested in preserving historic lifesaving 10 stations; and 11 (2) make available to the public, including 12 through the Internet, educational materials, research 13 aids, guides, bibliographies, and other information 14 regarding the Life-Saving Service and related orga-15 nizations that provided humanitarian assistance to 16 shipwrecked mariners, including— 17 (A) information on the history and devel-18 opment of the Life-Saving Service, predecessor 19 private and State lifesaving organizations, and 20 Coast Guard lifesaving stations; 21 (B) technical descriptions of lifesaving 22 boats, line-guns, life cars, and other lifesaving 23 gear; 24 (C) the inventory, documentation, and 25 evaluation prepared under subsection (b); and

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1	(D) guidance and technical assistance in
2	the listing of historic lifesaving stations in the
3	National Register of Historic Places.
4	(d) GRANTS.—
5	(1) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary, subject to
6	the availability of appropriations, shall make grants
7	to coordinate and assist preservation of historic life-
8	saving stations.
9	(2) COST SHARE.—The Federal share of the
10	cost of an activity carried out with financial assist-
11	ance under this subsection shall not exceed 75 per-
12	cent of the total cost of the activity.
13	(e) DEFINITIONS.—In this section:
14	(1) HISTORIC LIFESAVING STATION.—The term
15	"historic lifesaving station" means any land, struc-
