A BILL

To eliminate certain restrictions on the availability of credits under title III of the Energy Policy Act of 1992 for the use of biodiesel fuel, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. BIODIESEL FUEL USE CREDITS.**

4 Section 312 of the Energy Policy Act of 1992 (42
5 U.S.C. 13220) is amended—

6 (1) in subsection (b)—

7 (A) by striking “OF CREDITS” and all that
8 follows through “At the request” and inserting
9 “OF CREDITS.—At the request”; and

1 (B) by striking paragraph (2); and

2 (2) in subsection (c)—

3 (A) by striking “NOT” in the subsection

4 heading; and

5 (B) by striking “not”.

6 **SEC. 2. ALTERNATIVE FUELED VEHICLE MARKET STUDY**

7 **AND REPORT.**

8 (a) STUDY.—The Secretary of Energy shall conduct

9 a thorough study to determine—

10 (1) the availability and cost of light duty motor

11 vehicles that qualify as alternative fueled vehicles for

12 purposes of title V of the Energy Policy Act of 1992;

13 and

14 (2) the availability and cost of fuels that qualify

15 as alternative fuels for purposes of title V of the En-

16 ergy Policy Act of 1992.

17 (b) REPORT TO CONGRESS.—Not later than 1 year

18 after the date of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary

19 of Energy shall transmit to the Congress a report on the

20 results of the study conducted under subsection (a), in-

21 cluding any legislative recommendations.

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
