- 5 (a) Extension of Privileges.—Chapter 54 of title
- 6 10, United States Code, is amended by adding at the end
- 7 the following new section:

- 3 "(a) DISABLED VETERANS.—A veteran with a serv-

- 8 "(b) Dependent of a veteran who
- 9 is permitted under subsection (a) to use commissary and

- 13 "(c) Definitions.—In this section, the terms 'vet-
- 14 eran' and 'service-connected' have the meaning given such
- 15 terms in section 101 of title 38.".
- 16 (b) Clerical Amendments.—The table of sections
- 17 at the beginning of such chapter is amended by adding
- 18 at the end the following new item:

"1066. Use of commissary and exchange stores: disabled veterans and dependents"
