A BILL

To amend title 49, United States Code, to authorize appropriations for the National Transportation Safety Board for fiscal years 2003, 2004, and 2005, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

- 2 This Act may be cited as the "National Transportation
- 3 Safety Board Reauthorization Act of 2002".

4 TITLE I—NTSB

5 **REAUTHORIZATION**

- 6 SEC. 101. AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.
- 7 (a) Fiscal Years 2003–2005.—Section 1118(a) of
- 8 title 49, United States Code, is amended—
- 9 (1) by striking "and"; and
- 10 (2) by striking "such sums to" and inserting the
- 11 following: "\$73,325,000 for fiscal year 2003,
- 12 \$84,999,000 for fiscal year 2004, and \$89,687,000 for
- 13 fiscal year 2005. Such sums shall".
- 14 (b) Emergency Fund.—Section 1118(b) of such title
- 15 is amended by striking the second sentence and inserting
- 16 the following: "In addition, there are authorized to be ap-
- 17 propriated such sums as may be necessary to increase the
- 18 fund to, and maintain the fund at, a level of not to exceed
- 19 \$6,000,000.".
- 20 (c) NTSB ACADEMY.—Section 1118 of such title is
- 21 amended by adding at the end the following:
- 22 "(c) Academy.—There are authorized to be appro-
- 23 priated to the Board for necessary expenses of the National
- 24 Transportation Safety Board Academy, not otherwise pro-
- 25 vided for, \$3,347,000 for fiscal year 2003, \$4,896,000 for

1	fiscal year 2004, and \$4,995,000 for fiscal year 2005. Such
2	sums shall remain available until expended.".
3	SEC. 102. ACCIDENT AND SAFETY DATA CLASSIFICATION
4	AND PUBLICATION.
5	Section 1119 of title 49, United States Code, is amend-
6	ed by adding at the end the following:
7	"(c) Appeals.—
8	"(1) Notification of rights.—In any case in
9	which an employee of the Board determines that an
10	occurrence associated with the operation of an air-
11	craft constitutes an accident, the employee shall notify
12	the owner or operator of that aircraft of the right to
13	appeal that determination to the Board.
14	"(2) Procedure.—The Board shall establish
15	and publish the procedures for appeals under this
16	subsection.
17	"(3) Limitation on applicability.—This sub-
18	section shall not apply in the case of an accident that
19	results in a loss of life.".
20	SEC. 103. SECRETARY OF TRANSPORTATION'S RESPONSES
21	TO SAFETY RECOMMENDATIONS.
22	Section 1135(d) of title 49, United States Code, is
23	amended to read as follows:
24	"(d) Reporting Requirements.—

1 "(1) Annual secretarial regulatory status 2 REPORTS.—On February 1 of each year, the Secretary shall submit a report to Congress and the 3 Board containing the regulatory status of each sig-5 nificant safety recommendation made by the Board to 6 the Secretary (or to an Administration within the 7 Department). The Secretary shall continue to report 8 on the regulatory status of each such recommendation 9 in the report due on February 1 of subsequent years 10 until final regulatory action is taken on that rec-11 ommendation or the Secretary (or an Administration 12 within the Department) determines and states in such 13 a report that no action should be taken.

- "(2) Failure to report.—If on March 1 of each year the Board has not received the Secretary's report required by this subsection, the Board shall notify the Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure of the House of Representatives and the Committee on Commerce, Science, and Transportation of the Senate of the Secretary's failure to submit the required report.
- "(3) Significant safety recommendation de-Fined.—For the purposes of this subsection, the term 'significant safety recommendation' means a rec-

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1	ommendation included in the Board's 'most wanted
2	list'.
3	"(4) Termination.—This subsection shall cease
4	to be in effect after the report required to be filed on
5	February 1, 2007, is filed.".
6	SEC. 104. ASSISTANCE TO FAMILIES OF PASSENGERS IN-
7	VOLVED IN AIRCRAFT ACCIDENTS.
8	(a) Relinquishment of Investigative Priority.—
9	Section 1136 of title 49, United States Code, is amended
10	by adding at the end the following:
11	"(j) Relinquishment of Investigative Pri-
12	ORITY.—
13	"(1) General rule.—This section (other than
14	subsection (g)) shall not apply to an aircraft accident
15	if the Board has relinquished investigative priority
16	under section $1131(a)(2)(B)$ and the Federal agency
17	to which the Board relinquished investigative priority
18	is willing and able to provide assistance to the vic-
19	tims and families of the passengers involved in the
20	accident.
21	"(2) Board Assistance.—If this section does
22	not apply to an aircraft accident because the Board
23	has relinquished investigative priority with respect to
24	the accident, the Board shall assist, to the maximum
25	extent possible, the agency to which the Board has re-

- 1 linquished investigative priority in assisting families
- 2 with respect to the accident.".
- 3 (b) Revision of MOU.—Not later than 1 year after
- 4 the date of enactment of this Act, the National Transpor-
- 5 tation Safety Board and the Federal Bureau of Investiga-
- 6 tion shall revise their 1977 agreement on the investigation
- 7 of accidents to take into account the amendments made by
- 8 this section and title II and shall submit a copy of the re-
- 9 vised agreement to the Committee on Transportation and
- 10 Infrastructure of the House of Representatives and the Com-
- 11 mittee on Commerce, Science, and Transportation of the
- 12 Senate.
- 13 SEC. 105. TECHNICAL AMENDMENTS.
- 14 Section 1131(a)(2) of title 49, United States Code, is
- 15 amended by moving subparagraphs (B) and (C) 4 ems to
- 16 the left.
- 17 SEC. 106. ADVERSE EFFECTS OF CARRY-ON BAGGAGE.
- 18 (a) Study.—The National Transportation Safety
- 19 Board shall conduct a study to identify the adverse effects,
- 20 including passenger injuries or other safety problems, asso-
- 21 ciated with carry-on baggage stored in overhead bins
- 22 aboard passenger aircraft and sufficient ways to deal with
- 23 such problems.
- 24 (b) Report.—Not later than October 1, 2002, the
- 25 Board shall report to the Committee on Transportation and

6	SEC. 201. ASSISTANCE BY NATIONAL TRANSPORTATION		
7	SAFETY BOARD TO FAMILIES OF PASSENGERS		
8	INVOLVED IN RAIL PASSENGER ACCIDENTS.		
9	(a) In General.—Subchapter III of chapter 11 of		
10	title 49, United States Code, is amended by adding at the		
11	end the following:		
12	"§ 1138. Assistance to families of passengers involved		
13	in rail passenger accidents		
14	"(a) In General.—As soon as practicable after being		
15	notified of a rail passenger accident within the United		
16	States involving a rail passenger carrier and resulting in		
17	a major loss of life, the Chairman of the National Transpor-		
18	tation Safety Board shall—		
19	"(1) designate and publicize the name and phone		
20	number of a director of family support services who		
21	shall be an employee of the Board and shall be re-		
22	sponsible for acting as a point of contact within the		
23	Federal Government for the families of passengers in-		
24	volved in the accident and a liaison between the rail		
25	passenger carrier and the families; and		

1	"(2) designate an independent nonprofit organi-			
2	zation, with experience in disasters and posttrauma			
3	communication with families, which shall have pri-			
4	mary responsibility for coordinating the emotional			
5	care and support of the families of passengers in-			
6	volved in the accident.			
7	"(b) Responsibilities of the Board.—The Board			
8	shall have primary Federal responsibility for—			
9	"(1) facilitating the recovery and identification			
10	of fatally injured passengers involved in an accident			
11	described in subsection (a); and			
12	"(2) communicating with the families of pas-			
13	sengers involved in the accident as to the roles of—			
14	"(A) the organization designated for an ac-			
15	$cident\ under\ subsection\ (a)(2);$			
16	"(B) Government agencies; and			
17	"(C) the rail passenger carrier involved,			
18	with respect to the accident and the post-accident ac-			
19	tivities.			
20	"(c) Responsibilities of Designated Organiza-			
21	TION.—The organization designated for an accident under			
22	subsection (a)(2) shall have the following responsibilities			
23	with respect to the families of passengers involved in the			
24	accident:			

1	"(1) To provide mental health and counseling
2	services, in coordination with the disaster response
3	team of the rail passenger carrier involved.
4	"(2) To take such actions as may be necessary
5	to provide an environment in which the families may
6	grieve in private.
7	"(3) To meet with the families who have traveled
8	to the location of the accident, to contact the families
9	unable to travel to such location, and to contact all
10	affected families periodically thereafter until such
11	time as the organization, in consultation with the di-
12	rector of family support services designated for the ac-
13	cident under subsection (a)(1), determines that fur-
14	ther assistance is no longer needed.
15	"(4) To arrange a suitable memorial service, in
16	consultation with the families.
17	"(d) Passenger Lists.—
18	"(1) Requests for passenger lists.—
19	"(A) REQUESTS BY DIRECTOR OF FAMILY
20	Support services.—It shall be the responsi-
21	bility of the director of family support services
22	designated for an accident under subsection
23	(a)(1) to request, as soon as practicable, from the

rail passenger carrier involved in the accident a

list, which is based on the best available infor-

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1 mation at the time of the request, of the names 2 of the passengers that were aboard the rail passenger carrier's train involved in the accident. A 3 4 rail passenger carrier shall use reasonable efforts, 5 with respect to its unreserved trains, and pas-6 sengers not holding reservations on its other 7 trains, to ascertain the names of passengers 8 aboard a train involved in an accident.

- "(B) REQUESTS BY DESIGNATED ORGANIZA-TION.—The organization designated for an accident under subsection (a)(2) may request from the rail passenger carrier involved in the accident a list described in subparagraph (A).
- "(2) USE OF INFORMATION.—The director of family support services and the organization may not release to any person information on a list obtained under paragraph (1) but may provide information on the list about a passenger to the family of the passenger to the extent that the director of family support services or the organization considers appropriate.
- "(e) Continuing Responsibilities of the Board.—In the course of its investigation of an accident described in subsection (a), the Board shall, to the maximum extent practicable, ensure that the families of passengers involved in the accident—

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1	"(1) are briefed, prior to any public briefing,
2	about the accident and any other findings from the
3	investigation; and
4	"(2) are individually informed of and allowed to
5	attend any public hearings and meetings of the Board
6	about the accident.
7	"(f) Use of Rail Passenger Carrier Re-
8	SOURCES.—To the extent practicable, the organization des-
9	ignated for an accident under subsection (a)(2) shall coordi-
10	nate its activities with the rail passenger carrier involved
11	in the accident to facilitate the reasonable use of the re-
12	sources of the carrier.
13	"(g) Prohibited Actions.—
14	"(1) Actions to impede the board.—No per-
15	son (including a State or political subdivision) may
16	impede the ability of the Board (including the direc-
17	tor of family support services designated for an acci-
18	dent under subsection (a)(1)), or an organization des-
19	ignated for an accident under subsection (a)(2), to
20	carry out its responsibilities under this section or the
21	ability of the families of passengers involved in the
22	accident to have contact with one another.
23	"(2) Unsolicited communications.—No unso-
24	licited communication concerning a potential action

for personal injury or wrongful death may be made

by an attorney (including any associate, agent, employee, or other representative of an attorney) or any potential party to the litigation to an individual (other than an employee of the rail passenger carrier) injured in the accident, or to a relative of an individual involved in the accident, before the 45th day following the date of the accident.

"(3) Prohibition on actions to prevent
Mental Health and counseling services.—No
State or political subdivision may prevent the employees, agents, or volunteers of an organization designated for an accident under subsection (a)(2) from
providing mental health and counseling services
under subsection (c)(1) in the 30-day period beginning on the date of the accident. The director of family support services designated for the accident under
subsection (a)(1) may extend such period for not to
exceed an additional 30 days if the director determines that the extension is necessary to meet the
needs of the families and if State and local authorities are notified of the determination.

22 "(h) Definitions.—In this section, the following defi-23 nitions apply:

1	"(1) Rail passenger accident.—The term					
2	'rail passenger accident' means any rail passenger					
3	disaster occurring in the provision of—					
4	"(A) interstate intercity rail passenger

11	"(2) Rail passenger carrier.—The term 'rail					
12	passenger carrier' means a rail carrier providing—					
13	"(A) interstate intercity rail passenger					
14	transportation (as such term is defined in sec-					
15	tion 24102); or					
16	"(B) interstate or intrastate high-speed rail					
17	(as such term is defined in section 26105) trans-					
18	portation,					
19	except that such term shall not include a tourist, his-					
20	toric, scenic, or excursion rail carrier.					
21	"(3) Passenger.—The term 'passenger'					
22	includes—					
23	"(A) an employee of a rail passenger car-					
24	rier aboard a train;					

1	"(B) any other person aboard the train				
2	without regard to whether the person paid for the				
3	transportation, occupied a seat, or held a re				
4	ervation for the rail transportation; and				
5	"(C) any other person injured or killed in				
6	the accident.				
7	"(i) Limitation on Statutory Construction.—				
8	Nothing in this section may be construed as limiting the				
9	actions that a rail passenger carrier may take, or the obli-				
10	gations that a rail passenger carrier may have, in pro-				
11	viding assistance to the families of passengers involved in				
12	a rail passenger accident.				
13	"(j) Relinquishment of Investigative Pri-				
14	ORITY.—				
15	"(1) General rule.—This section (other than				
16	subsection (g)) shall not apply to a railroad accident				
17	if the Board has relinquished investigative priority				
18	under section 1131(a)(2)(B) and the Federal agency				
19	to which the Board relinquished investigative priority				
20	is willing and able to provide assistance to the vic-				
21	tims and families of the passengers involved in the				
22	accident.				
23	"(2) Board Assistance.—If this section does				
24	not apply to a railroad accident because the Board				
25	has relinauished investigative priority with respect to

3	linquished investigative priority in assisting families					
4	with respect to the accident.".

9	NEEDS OF FAMILIES OF PASSENGERS IN

11	(a) In General.—Part C of subtitle V of title 49,					
12	United States Code, is amended by adding at the end the					
13	following new chapter:					
14	"CHAPTER 251—FAMILY ASSISTANCE					
	"Sec. "25101. Plans to address needs of families of passengers involved in rail passenger accidents.					
15	"§ 25101. Plans to address needs of families of pas-					
16	sengers involved in rail passenger acci-

"(a) Submission of Plans.—Not later than 6 months

gather the date of the enactment of this section, each rail passenger carrier shall submit to the Secretary of Transportation and the Chairman of the National Transportation

Safety Board a plan for addressing the needs of the families

- of passengers involved in any rail passenger accident in-
- volving a train of the rail passenger carrier and resulting
- 3 in a major loss of life.

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- 4 "(b) Contents of Plans.—A plan to be submitted
- by a rail passenger carrier under subsection (a) shall in-
- clude, at a minimum, the following: 6
- 7 "(1) A plan for publicizing a reliable, toll-free 8 telephone number, and for providing staff, to handle 9 calls from the families of the passengers.
- 10 "(2) A process for notifying the families of the passengers, before providing any public notice of the 12 names of the passengers, either by utilizing the serv-13 ices of the organization designated for the accident under section 1138(a)(2) of this title or the services 14 15 of other suitably trained individuals.
 - "(3) An assurance that the notice described in paragraph (2) will be provided to the family of a passenger as soon as the rail passenger carrier has verified that the passenger was aboard the train (whether or not the names of all of the passengers have been verified) and, to the extent practicable, in person.
 - "(4) An assurance that the rail passenger carrier will provide to the director of family support services designated for the accident under section 1138(a)(1)

- of this title, and to the organization designated for the accident under section 1138(a)(2) of this title, immediately upon request, a list (which is based on the best available information at the time of the request) of the names of the passengers aboard the train (whether or not such names have been verified), and will periodically update the list. The plan shall include a procedure, with respect to unreserved trains and passengers not holding reservations on other trains, for the rail passenger carrier to use reasonable efforts to ascertain the names of passengers aboard a train involved in an accident.
 - "(5) An assurance that the family of each passenger will be consulted about the disposition of all remains and personal effects of the passenger within the control of the rail passenger carrier.
 - "(6) An assurance that if requested by the family of a passenger, any possession of the passenger within the control of the rail passenger carrier (regardless of its condition) will be returned to the family unless the possession is needed for the accident investigation or any criminal investigation.
 - "(7) An assurance that any unclaimed possession of a passenger within the control of the rail pas-

- senger carrier will be retained by the rail passenger
 carrier for at least 18 months.
 - "(8) An assurance that the family of each passenger or other person killed in the accident will be consulted about construction by the rail passenger carrier of any monument to the passengers, including any inscription on the monument.
 - "(9) An assurance that the treatment of the families of nonrevenue passengers will be the same as the treatment of the families of revenue passengers.
 - "(10) An assurance that the rail passenger carrier will work with any organization designated under section 1138(a)(2) of this title on an ongoing basis to ensure that families of passengers receive an appropriate level of services and assistance following each accident.
 - "(11) An assurance that the rail passenger carrier will provide reasonable compensation to any organization designated under section 1138(a)(2) of this title for services provided by the organization.
 - "(12) An assurance that the rail passenger carrier will assist the family of a passenger in traveling to the location of the accident and provide for the physical care of the family while the family is staying at such location.

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- 1 "(13) An assurance that the rail passenger car-2 rier will commit sufficient resources to carry out the 3 plan.
- "(14) An assurance that the rail passenger carrier will provide adequate training to the employees and agents of the carrier to meet the needs of survivors and family members following an accident.
- 8 "(15) An assurance that, upon request of the 9 family of a passenger, the rail passenger carrier will 10 inform the family of whether the passenger's name 11 appeared on any preliminary passenger manifest for 12 the train involved in the accident.
- 13 "(c) Limitation on Liability.—A rail passenger car-14 rier shall not be liable for damages in any action brought 15 in a Federal or State court arising out of the performance 16 of the rail passenger carrier in preparing or providing a passenger list, or in providing information concerning a 18 train reservation, pursuant to a plan submitted by the rail 19 passenger carrier under subsection (b), unless such liability 20 was caused by conduct of the rail passenger carrier which 21 was grossly negligent or which constituted intentional mis-22 conduct.
- 23 "(d) Definitions.—In this section—

1	"(1) the terms 'rail passenger accident' and 'rail
2	passenger carrier' have the meanings such terms have
3	in section 1138 of this title; and
4	"(2) the term 'passenger' means a person aboard
5	a rail passenger carrier's train that is involved in a
6	rail passenger accident.
7	"(e) Limitation on Statutory Construction.—
8	Nothing in this section may be construed as limiting the
9	actions that a rail passenger carrier may take, or the obli-
10	gations that a rail passenger carrier may have, in pro-
11	viding assistance to the families of passengers involved in
12	a rail passenger accident.".
13	(b) Conforming Amendment.—The table of chapters
