## AN ACT

To amend title 18, United States Code, with respect to crimes involving the transportation of persons and sex tourism.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2       *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

1 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

2 This Act may be cited as the “Sex Tourism Prohibi-  
3 tion Improvement Act of 2002”.

4 **SEC. 2. SECTION 2423 AMENDMENTS.**

5 (a) IN GENERAL.—Section 2423 of title 18, United  
6 States Code, is amended by striking subsection (b) and  
7 inserting the following:

8 “(b) TRAVEL WITH INTENT TO ENGAGE IN ILLICIT  
9 SEXUAL CONDUCT.—A person who travels in interstate  
10 commerce or travels into the United States, or a United  
11 States citizen or an alien admitted for permanent resi-  
12 dence in the United States who travels in foreign com-  
13 merce, for the purpose of engaging in any illicit sexual  
14 conduct with another person shall be fined under this title  
15 or imprisoned not more than 15 years, or both.

16 “(c) ENGAGING IN ILLICIT SEXUAL CONDUCT IN  
17 FOREIGN PLACES.—Any United States citizen or alien ad-  
18 mitted for permanent residence who travels in foreign  
19 commerce, and engages in any illicit sexual conduct with  
20 another person shall be fined under this title or imprisoned  
21 not more than 15 years, or both.

22 “(d) ANCILLARY OFFENSES.—Whoever arranges, in-  
23 duces, procures, or facilitates the travel of a person know-  
24 ing that such a person is traveling in interstate commerce  
25 or foreign commerce for the purpose of engaging in illicit

1 sexual conduct shall be fined under this title, imprisoned  
2 not more than 15 years, or both.

3 “(e) ATTEMPT AND CONSPIRACY.—Whoever at-  
4 tempts or conspires to violate subsection (a), (b), (c), or  
5 (d) shall be punishable in the same manner as a completed  
6 violation of that subsection.

7 “(f) DEFINITION.—As used in this section, the term  
8 ‘illicit sexual conduct’ means (1) a sexual act (as defined  
9 in section 2246) with a person that would be in violation  
10 of chapter 109A if the sexual act occurred in the special  
11 maritime and territorial jurisdiction of the United States;  
12 or (2) any commercial sex act (as defined in section 1591)  
13 with a person who the individual engaging in the commer-  
14 cial sex act, knows or should have known has not attained  
15 the age of 18 years.”.

16 (b) CONFORMING AMENDMENT.—Section 2423(a) of  
17 title 18, United States Code, is amended by striking “or  
18 attempts to do so,”.
