- To amend title 18, United States Code, with respect to crimes involving the transportation of persons and sex tourism.
 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

2 This Act may be cited as the "Sex Tourism Prohibi3 tion Improvement Act of 2002".

4 SEC. 2. SECTION 2423 AMENDMENTS.

5 (a) IN GENERAL. Section 2423 of title 18, United
6 States Code, is amended by striking subsection (b) and
7 inserting the following:

8 "(b) TRAVEL WITH INTENT TO ENGAGE IN ILLICIT SEXUAL CONDUCT.—A person who travels in interstate 9 commerce or travels into the United States, or a United 10 States eitizen or an alien admitted for permanent resi-11 dence in the United States who travels in foreign com-12 merce, for the purpose of engaging in any illicit sexual 13 conduct with another person shall be fined under this title 14 or imprisoned not more than 15 years, or both. 15

16 "(c) ENGAGING IN ILLICIT SEXUAL CONDUCT IN 17 FOREIGN PLACES.—Any United States citizen or alien ad-18 mitted for permanent residence who travels in foreign 19 commerce, and engages in any illicit sexual conduct with 20 another person shall be fined under this title or imprisoned 21 not more than 15 years, or both.

22 "(d) ANCILLARY OFFENSES.—Whoever arranges, in23 duces, procures, or facilitates the travel of a person know24 ing that such a person is traveling in interstate commerce
25 or foreign commerce for the purpose of engaging in illicit

sexual conduct shall be fined under this title, imprisoned
 not more than 15 years, or both.

3 "(e) ATTEMPT AND CONSPIRACY.—Whoever at-4 tempts or conspires to violate subsection (a), (b), (c), or 5 (d) shall be punishable in the same manner as a completed 6 violation of that subsection.

7 "(f) DEFINITION.—As used in this section, the term 8 'illicit sexual conduct' means a sexual act (as defined in 9 section 2246) with a person that would be in violation of 10 chapter 109A if the sexual act occurred in the special mar-11 itime and territorial jurisdiction of the United States or 12 any commercial sex act (as defined in section 1591), with 13 a person who has not attained the age of 18 years.".

14 (b) CONFORMING AMENDMENT. Section 2423(a) of
15 title 18, United States Code, is amended by striking "or
16 attempts to do so".

17 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

18 This Act may be cited as the "Sex Tourism Prohibition19 Improvement Act of 2002".

7 "(c) ENGAGING IN ILLICIT SEXUAL CONDUCT IN FOR8 EIGN PLACES.—Any United States citizen or alien admit9 ted for permanent residence who travels in foreign com10 merce, and engages in any illicit sexual conduct with an11 other person shall be fined under this title or imprisoned
12 not more than 15 years, or both.

"(d) ANCILLARY OFFENSES.—Whoever arranges, induces, procures, or facilitates the travel of a person knowing
that such a person is traveling in interstate commerce or
foreign commerce for the purpose of engaging in illicit sexual conduct shall be fined under this title, imprisoned not
more than 15 years, or both.

19 "(e) ATTEMPT AND CONSPIRACY.—Whoever attempts
20 or conspires to violate subsection (a), (b), (c), or (d) shall
21 be punishable in the same manner as a completed violation
22 of that subsection.

23 "(f) DEFINITION.—As used in this section, the term 'il24 licit sexual conduct' means (1) a sexual act (as defined in
25 section 2246) with a person that would be in violation of

chapter 109A if the sexual act occurred in the special mari time and territorial jurisdiction of the United States; or
 (2) any commercial sex act (as defined in section 1591)
 with a person who the individual engaging in the commer cial sex act, knows or should have known has not attained
 the age of 18 years.".
