3 **SECTION 1. EXTENSION OF IRISH PEACE PROCESS CUL-**
4 **TURAL AND TRAINING PROGRAM.**

7 amended—

8 (1) in subsection (a)(2)(A) by striking “3” and

12 (3) in subsection (d)(1) by striking “2005,”
13 and inserting “2006,”; and

14 (4) in subsection (d)(2) by striking “2005,”
15 and inserting “2006,”.
