## A BILL

To revise the boundary of the Allegheny Portage Railroad National Historic Site, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Allegheny Portage
- 5 Railroad National Historic Site Boundary Revision Act".
- 6 SEC. 2. DEFINITIONS.
- 7 In this Act:
- 8 (1) Historic site.—The term "historic site"
- 9 means the Allegheny Portage Railroad National His-
- toric Site in Blair and Cambria Counties, Pennsyl-

1	vania, established pursuant to Public Law 88–546
2	(78 Stat. 752; 16 U.S.C. 461 note).
3	(2) MAP.—The term "Map" means the map en-
4	titled "Allegheny Portage Railroad National Historic
5	Site, Blair and Cambria Counties, Pennsylvania",
6	numbered NERO $423/80,014$ and dated May $01.$
7	(3) Secretary.—The term "Secretary" means
8	the Secretary of the Interior, acting through the Di-
9	rector of the National Park Service.
10	SEC. 3. REVISION OF HISTORIC SITE BOUNDARIES.
11	(a) Lands Excluded From and Added to His-
12	TORIC SITE.—The boundary of the historic site is hereby
13	revised—
14	(1) by deleting—
15	(A) the approximately 3.09 acres depicted
16	on the Map as parcels 105–21 and 105–15; and
17	(B) the approximately 7.26 acres depicted
18	on the Map as parcel 102–42; and
19	(2) by adding the approximately 52.17 acres de-
20	picted on the Map as parcel 101–09.
21	(b) Authorization for Acquisitions.—
22	(1) Acquisition 1.—
23	(A) In General.—The Secretary is au-
24	thorized to acquire, from willing owners only,
25	the approximately 98 acres depicted on the Map

1	as parcel 103–07 in exchange for the approxi-
2	mately 108 acres depicted on the Map as parce
3	102–38.
4	(B) Equalization of values.—If the
5	values of the parcels to be exchanged under
6	subparagraph (A) are not equal, the difference
7	may be equalized by donation, payment using
8	donated or appropriated funds, or the convey-
9	ance of additional land.
10	(2) Acquisition 2.—The Secretary is author-
11	ized to acquire by exchange or donation, from willing
12	owners only, the approximately 15 acres depicted or
13	the Map as parcel 104–07.
14	(c) Revision of Boundaries After Acquisi-
15	TIONS.—Upon completion of the exchange under sub-
16	section (b)(1) or the acquisition under subsection (b)(2)
17	the boundaries of the historic site shall be revised, as
18	appropriate—
19	(1) by adding the land acquired by the United
20	States; and
21	(2) by deleting the land that is no longer owned
22	by the United States.

### 1 SEC. 4. CHANGES TO AND AVAILABILITY OF MAP.

- 2 (a) Changes to Map.—The Secretary shall revise
- 3 the Map to reflect boundaries adjustments to the historic
- 4 site under this Act.
- 5 (b) AVAILABILITY OF MAP.—A copy of the Map shall
- 6 be on file and available for inspection in the appropriate
- 7 offices of the National Park Service, Department of the
- 8 Interior.

### 9 SEC. 5. ADMINISTRATION OF ACQUIRED LANDS.

- 10 Lands and interests in lands added to the historic
- 11 site under this Act shall be administered by the Secretary
- 12 as part of the historic site in accordance with applicable
- 13 laws and regulations.

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
