## A BILL

To revise the boundary of the Allegheny Portage Railroad National Historic Site, and for other purposes.

1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

**3** SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Allegheny Portage

5 Railroad National Historic Site Boundary Revision Act".

#### 1 SEC. 2. DEFINITIONS.

2 In this Act:

3	(1) HISTORIC SITE.—The term "historic site"
4	means the Allegheny Portage Railroad National His-
5	toric Site in Blair and Cambria Counties, Pennsyl-
6	vania, established pursuant to Public Law 88–546
7	(78 Stat. 752; 16 U.S.C. 461 note).
8	(2) MAP.—The term "Map" means the map en-
9	titled "Allegheny Portage Railroad National Historic
10	Site, Blair and Cambria Counties, Pennsylvania",
11	numbered NERO 423/80,014 and dated May 01.
12	(3) Secretary.—The term "Secretary" means
13	the Secretary of the Interior, acting through the Di-
14	rector of the National Park Service.
15	SEC. 3. REVISION OF HISTORIC SITE BOUNDARIES.
16	(a) Lands Excluded From and Added to His-
17	TORIC SITE.—The boundary of the historic site is hereby
18	revised—
19	(1) by deleting—
20	(A) the approximately 3.09 acres depicted
21	on the Map as parcels 105–21 and 105–15; and
22	(B) the approximately 7.26 acres depicted
23	on the Map as parcel 102–42; and
24	(2) by adding the approximately 52.17 acres de-
25	picted on the Map as parcel 101–09.
26	(b) AUTHORIZATION FOR ACQUISITIONS.—

(1) Acquisition 1.—

2 (A) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary is au-3 thorized to acquire, from willing owners only, 4 the approximately 98 acres depicted on the Map 5 as parcel 103–07 in exchange for the approxi-6 mately 108 acres depicted on the Map as parcel 102 - 38.7 8 (B) EQUALIZATION OF VALUES.—If the 9 values of the parcels to be exchanged under 10 subparagraph (A) are not equal, the difference

may be equalized by donation, payment using
donated or appropriated funds, or the conveyance of additional land.

14 (2) ACQUISITION 2.—The Secretary is author15 ized to acquire by exchange or donation, from willing
16 owners only, the approximately 15 acres depicted on
17 the Map as parcel 104–07.

(c) REVISION OF BOUNDARIES AFTER ACQUISITIONS.—Upon completion of the exchange under subsection (b)(1) or the acquisition under subsection (b)(2),
the boundaries of the historic site shall be revised, as
appropriate—

23 (1) by adding the land acquired by the United24 States; and

(2) by deleting the land that is no longer owned
 by the United States.

#### 3 SEC. 4. CHANGES TO AND AVAILABILITY OF MAP.

4 (a) CHANGES TO MAP.—The Secretary shall revise
5 the Map to reflect boundaries adjustments to the historic
6 site under this Act.

7 (b) AVAILABILITY OF MAP.—A copy of the Map shall
8 be on file and available for inspection in the appropriate
9 offices of the National Park Service, Department of the
10 Interior.

#### 11 SEC. 5. ADMINISTRATION OF ACQUIRED LANDS.

Lands and interests in lands added to the historic
site under this Act shall be administered by the Secretary
as part of the historic site in accordance with applicable
laws and regulations.
