## **AN ACT**

- To prohibit members of the Armed Forces in Saudi Arabia from being required or formally or informally compelled to wear the abaya garment, and for other purposes.
  - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
  - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

## SECTION 1. WEAR OF ABAYAS BY MEMBERS OF THE ARMED FORCES IN SAUDI ARABIA.

(a) PROHIBITION RELATING TO WEAR OF ABAYAS.—
4 A member of the Armed Forces may not be required or
5 formally or informally compelled to wear the abaya gar6 ment or any part of the abaya garment while in the King7 dom of Saudi Arabia pursuant to a permanent change of
8 station or orders for temporary duty.

9 (b) INSTRUCTION.—(1) The Secretary of Defense shall provide each member of the Armed Forces ordered 10 to a permanent change of station or temporary duty in 11 the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia with instructions regarding 12 13 the prohibition in subsection (a). Such instructions shall be provided to a member within 10 days before the date 14 of a member's arrival at a United States military installa-15 16 tion within the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia or immediately upon such arrival. The instructions shall be presented 17 18 orally and in writing. The written instruction shall include 19 the full text of this section.

(2) In carrying out paragraph (1), the Secretary shall
act through the Commander in Chief, United States Central Command and Joint Task Force Southwest Asia, and
the commanders of the Army, Navy, Air Force, and Marine Corps components of the United States Central Command and Joint Task Force Southwest Asia.

(c) PROHIBITION ON USE OF FUNDS FOR PROCURE-1 2 MENT OF ABAYAS.—Funds appropriated or otherwise made available to the Department of Defense may not be 3 4 used to procure abayas for regular or routine issuance to 5 members of the Armed Forces serving in the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia or for any personnel of contractors accom-6 7 panying the Armed Forces in the Kingdom of Saudi Ara-8 bia in the performance of contracts entered into with such 9 contractors by the United States.

## 10 SEC. 2. COMMANDER AUTHORITY.

11 Notwithstanding subsection (a) of section 1, the com-12 mander of the United States Central Command may re-13 quire the wear of the abaya garment in specific cir-14 cumstances that, in the opinion of the commander, con-15 stitute an operational requirement essential for the con-16 duct of the military mission.
