A BILL

To require the Secretary of the Interior to establish a national research program to address the animal disease known as chronic wasting disease, which is afflicting wild deer and elk herds in many States, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Chronic Wasting Dis-
- 5 ease Research and Response Act of 2002".

2 SEC. 2. DEPARTMENT OF THE INTERIOR PROGRAM TO AD-2 DRESS CHRONIC WASTING DISEASE. 3 (a) Establishment of Program.—The Secretary 4 of the Interior shall establish and coordinate a national 5 research program to assess chronic wasting disease. 6 (b) ELEMENTS OF PROGRAM.—Under the program, the Secretary shall— 7 8 (1) develop a long-term program to provide States with technical and financial assistance and 9 10 timely information to prevent the expansion of 11 chronic wasting disease; 12 (2) design a national program for the moni-13 toring and surveillance of chronic wasting disease in 14 wild deer and elk and other wildlife populations and 15 assess whether chronic wasting disease is present in 16 free-ranging populations of cervids adjacent to the 17 endemic area and in new areas of infestation; 18 (3) conduct research to determine how chronic 19 wasting disease is transmitted in wild deer and elk 20 and the extent of the risk of transmission of the dis-21 ease; 22 (4) evaluate ecological and environmental fac-

tors responsible for the emergence, growth, reproduction, and persistence of chronic wasting disease in the environment;

- 1 (5) develop and provide modeling and analytical 2 strategies to identify, track, and manage the spread 3 of chronic wasting disease;
 - (6) investigate and develop new non-lethal detection and diagnostic methods and techniques to identify chronic wasting disease in free-ranging cervid populations;
 - (7) investigate and develop safe methods of disposal for carcasses that are or may be infected with chronic wasting disease;
 - (8) instruct Federal land managers in areas in proximity to chronic wasting disease endemic areas or areas of new infestation outside of endemic areas to conduct comprehensive assessments of free-ranging cervid populations to determine the presence of chronic wasting disease, the likelihood of transmission to adjacent non-Federal lands, and management options for chronic wasting disease infestations; and
 - (9) develop a public outreach and education strategy for the hunting community and general public to inform them about the origin, spread, and risks associated with chronic wasting disease.
- 24 (c) Consultation.—The Secretary shall establish 25 and conduct the program in consultation with the States,

- 1 other Federal agencies, nongovernmental organizations,
- 2 and colleges and universities.
- 3 (d) Implementation Report.—Within 180 days
- 4 after the date of the date of the enactment of this Act,
- 5 the Secretary shall submit to the Committee on Resources
- 6 of the House of Representatives and the Committee on
- 7 Energy and Natural Resources of the Senate a report de-
- 8 scribing the progress made in implementing this section.
- 9 (e) Definitions.—In this section:
- 10 (1) The term "chronic wasting disease" means
- 11 the transmissible animal disease that afflicts deer
- and elk and belongs to the group of diseases known
- as transmissible spongiform encephalopathies.
- 14 (2) The term "Secretary" means the Secretary
- of the Interior, acting through the Director of the
- 16 United States Geological Survey.
- 17 (f) Authorization of Appropriations.—There
- 18 are authorized to be appropriated to the Secretary such
- 19 sums as are necessary to carry out the program. Amounts
- 20 so appropriated shall remain available until expended.
