A BILL

To direct the Secretary of Education to provide grants to promote Holocaust education and awareness.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Holocaust Education

5 and Awareness Act of 2001".

6 SEC. 2. FINDINGS.

7 The Congress finds the following:

8 (1) The Holocaust was the government-spon9 sored event that occurred in Europe between 1933

1	and 1945 in which Nazis and their collaborators—
2	both to suppress dissidence and in the name of ra-
3	cial, ethnic, and social purity—systemically mur-
4	dered 11 million people, including Jews, Jehovah's
5	Witnesses, Serbs, Gypsies, homosexuals, Polish intel-
6	ligentsia, and German opponents of Nazism.
7	(2) Six States—California, Florida, Illinois,
8	Massachusetts, New Jersey, and New York—cur-
9	rently mandate that the Holocaust be taught in the
10	educational curriculum and ten States—Connecticut,
11	Georgia, Indiana, North Carolina, Ohio, Pennsyl-
12	vania, South Carolina, Tennessee, Virginia, and
13	Washington—recommend teaching the Holocaust
14	but do not provide sufficient funds to assist in train-
15	ing and educating teachers about it.
16	(3) Revisionist historians and Holocaust deniers
17	throughout the world, including those in the United
18	States, perpetuate inaccuracies and falsehoods re-
19	garding the Holocaust and thereby make it more dif-
20	ficult for educators effectively to teach students
21	about the Holocaust.
22	SEC. 3. GRANTS FOR HOLOCAUST EDUCATION AND AWARE-
23	NESS.
24	(a) IN GENERAL — The Secretary of Education shall

24 (a) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary of Education shall25 devise and administer a program to make grants—

1	(1) to provide the necessary tools and resources
2	to educate Americans regarding the Holocaust;
3	(2) to dispel falsehoods circulated by Holocaust
4	deniers; and
5	(3) to facilitate Holocaust awareness in commu-
6	nities throughout the United States.
7	(b) REQUIREMENTS.—Such program shall—
8	(1) provide for grants of not more than
9	\$10,000 each for new or existing Holocaust edu-
10	cation programs;
11	(2) condition each grant on assurance of match-
12	ing funds either from State or local governmental
13	sources or from private sources, or from both, com-
14	bined to total not less than 50 percent of the
15	amount of Federal funds to be provided by such
16	grant; and
17	(3) be established in coordination with the
18	United States Holocaust Memorial Council estab-
19	lished under chapter 23 of title 36, United States
20	Code.
21	(c) REPORTS TO CONGRESS.—The Secretary of Edu-
22	cation shall submit to the Congress a report detailing the
23	criteria used in administering the grant program in sub-
24	section (a) and listing program expenditures and grant
25	amounts and recipients. Such report shall be submitted

not later than 180 days after the date on which funds
 are appropriated to carry out this Act and twice annually
 thereafter for the duration of the program.

- 4 (d) DEFINITIONS.—In this Act:
- 5 (1) The term "Holocaust" means the historical
 6 event described in section 2(1).

7 (2) The term "Holocaust education program"
8 means a program which encourages and promotes
9 awareness and historical accuracy about the Holo10 caust in public and private schools, community
11 groups, State and local governments, and other or12 ganizations.

(e) REGULATIONS AUTHORIZED.—The Secretary ofEducation may establish regulations to carry out this Act.

15 SEC. 4. AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.

There is authorized to be appropriated to carry out
this Act \$3,000,000 for each of fiscal years 2002 through
2006, to remain available until expended.

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
