18	Secretary of Education, may make allotments to State edu-
19	cational agencies, United States territories, and Indian
20	tribes to pay for the Federal share of—
21	"(1) planning and building the capacity within
22	the State to implement service-learning programs that
23	are based principally in elementary and secondary
24	schools, including—

1	"(A) providing training for teachers, super-
2	visors, personnel from community-based agencies
3	(particularly with regard to the utilization of
4	participants), and trainers, to be conducted by
5	qualified individuals or organizations that have
6	experience with service-learning;
7	"(B) developing service-learning curricula,
8	consistent with State or local student academic
9	achievement standards, to be integrated into aca-
10	demic programs, including an age-appropriate
11	learning component that provides participants
12	an opportunity to analyze and apply their serv-
13	ice experiences;
14	"(C) forming local partnerships described in
15	paragraph (2) or (4) to develop school-based
16	service-learning programs in accordance with
17	this part;
18	"(D) devising appropriate methods for re-
19	search and evaluation of the educational value of
20	service-learning and the effect of service-learning
21	activities on communities; and
22	"(E) establishing effective outreach and dis-
23	semination of information to ensure the broadest
24	possible involvement of community-based agen-

1	cies with demonstrated effectiveness in working
2	with school-age youth in their communities;
3	"(2) implementing, operating, or expanding
4	school-based service-learning programs, which may
5	include paying for the cost of the recruitment, train-
6	ing, supervision, placement, salaries, and benefits of
7	service-learning coordinators, through distribution of
8	Federal funds by State educational agencies made
9	available under this part to projects operated by local
10	partnerships among—
11	"(A) local educational agencies; and
12	"(B) 1 or more community partners that—
13	"(i) shall include a public or private
14	nonprofit organization that—
15	"(I) has a demonstrated expertise
16	in the provision of services to meet
17	unmet human, education, environ-
18	mental, or public safety needs; and
19	"(II) will make projects available
20	for participants, who shall be students;
21	and
22	"(ii) may include a private for-profit
23	business or private elementary or secondary
24	school;

1	"(3) planning of school-based service-learning
2	programs, through distribution by State educational
3	agencies of Federal funds made available under this
4	part to local educational agencies, which planning
5	may include paying for the cost of—
6	"(A) the salaries and benefits of service-
7	learning coordinators; or
8	"(B) the recruitment, training, supervision,
9	and placement of service-learning coordinators
10	who may be participants in a program under
11	subtitle C or receive a national service edu-
12	cational award under subtitle D,
13	who will identify the community partners described
14	in paragraph (2)(B) and assist in the design and im-
15	plementation of a program described in paragraph
16	(2); or
17	"(4) implementing, operating, or expanding
18	school-based service-learning programs to utilize serv-
19	ice-learning to improve the education of students,
20	through distribution by State educational agencies of
21	Federal funds made available under this part to—
22	"(A) local educational agencies;
23	"(B) public or private nonprofit organiza-
24	tions;
25	"(C) other educational agencies; or

1	"(D) partnerships or combinations of local
2	educational agencies and entities described in
3	subparagraphs (B) and (C).
4	"(b) Duties of Service-Learning Coordinator.—
5	A service-learning coordinator referred to in paragraph (2)
6	or (3) of subsection (a) shall provide services that may
7	include—
8	"(1) providing technical assistance and informa-
9	tion to, and facilitating the training of, teachers who
10	want to use service-learning in their classrooms;
11	"(2) assisting local partnerships described in
12	subsection (a) in the planning, development, and exe-
13	cution of service-learning projects; and
14	"(3) carrying out such other duties as the recipi-
15	ent of assistance under this part may determine to be
16	appropriate.
17	"(c) Related Expenses.—An entity that receives fi-
18	nancial assistance under this part may, in carrying out
19	the activities described in subsection (a), use such assistance
20	to pay for the Federal share of reasonable costs related to
21	the supervision of participants, program administration,
22	transportation, insurance, and evaluations and for other
23	reasonable expenses related to the activities.

2	"(a) Indian Tribes and Territories.—Of the
3	amounts appropriated to carry out this part for any fiscal
4	year, the Corporation shall reserve an amount of not more
5	than 3 percent for payments to Indian tribes, the United

7	Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands, to be al-
8	lotted in accordance with their respective needs.
9	"(b) Allotments Through States.—After reserv-
10	ing amounts under subsection (a), the Corporation shall use
11	the remainder of the funds appropriated to carry out this
12	part for any fiscal year as follows:
13	"(1) Allotments.—
14	"(A) School-age youth.—From 50 per-
15	cent of such remainder, the Corporation shall
16	allot to each State an amount that bears the
17	same ratio to 50 percent of such remainder as
18	the number of school-age youth in the State bears
19	to the total number of school-age youth of all
20	States.
21	"(B) Allocation under elementary and
22	SECONDARY EDUCATION ACT OF 1965.—From 50
23	percent of such remainder, the Corporation shall
24	allot to each State an amount that bears the
25	same ratio to 50 percent of such remainder as
26	the allocation to the State for the previous fiscal

1 year under title I of the Elementary and Sec-2 ondary Education Act of 1965 (20 U.S.C. 2711 3 et seq.) or its successor authority bears to such 4 allocations to all States. Definition.—Notwithstanding 5 section 6 101(26), for purposes of this subsection, the term 7 'State' means each of the several States, the District 8 of Columbia, and the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico. "(c) Reallotment.—If the Corporation determines 9 that the allotment of a State or Indian tribe under this 10 section will not be required for a fiscal year because the State or Indian tribe does not submit an application for 12 the allotment under section 113 that meets the requirements of such section and such other requirements as the Chief Executive Officer may determine to be appropriate, the Corporation shall make any remainder of such allotment available for reallotment to such other States and Indian tribes, with approved applications submitted under section 113, 18 as the Corporation may determine to be appropriate. 19 20 "SEC. 113. APPLICATIONS. 21 "An application for an allotment under this part shall 22 include— 23 "(1) a proposal for a 3-year plan promoting 24 service-learning, which shall contain such information 25 as the Chief Executive Officer may reasonably re-

1	quire, including how the applicant will integrate
2	service opportunities into the academic program of
3	the participants;
4	"(2) information, when applicable, about the ap-
5	plicant's efforts to—
6	"(A) include any opportunities for students
7	enrolled in schools or other programs of edu-
8	cation providing elementary or secondary edu-
9	cation under State law to participate in service-
10	learning programs and ensure that such service-
11	learning programs include opportunities for such
12	students to serve together;
13	"(B) involve participants in the design and
14	operation of the program;
15	"(C) promote service-learning in areas of
16	greatest need, including low-income areas;
17	"(D) ensure that students of different ages,
18	races, sexes, ethnic groups, disabilities, and eco-
19	nomic backgrounds have opportunities to serve
20	together; and
21	"(E) otherwise integrate service opportuni-
22	ties into the academic program of the partici-
23	pants; and
24	"(3) assurances that the applicant will comply
25	with the nonduplication and nondisplacement re-

1	quirements of section 177 and the grievance proce-
2	dures required by section 176.
3	"SEC. 114. CONSIDERATION OF APPLICATIONS.
4	"In considering applications under this part, the Cor-
5	poration shall use criteria that include those approved by
6	the Board of Directors.
7	"SEC. 115. FEDERAL, STATE, AND LOCAL CONTRIBUTIONS.
8	"(a) Federal Share.—
9	"(1) In general.—The Federal share of the cost
10	of carrying out a program for which a grant is made
11	under this part may not exceed 50 percent of the total
12	cost of the program.
13	"(2) Non-federal contribution.—In pro-
14	viding for the remaining share of the cost of carrying
15	out such a program, each recipient of a grant under
16	this part—
17	"(A) shall provide for such share through a
18	payment in cash or in kind, fairly evaluated, in-
19	cluding facilities, equipment, or services; and
20	"(B) may provide for such share through
21	State sources or local sources.
22	"(b) Waiver.—The Chief Executive Officer may waive
23	the requirements of subsection (a) in whole or in part with
24	respect to any such program in any fiscal year if the Cor-
25	poration determines that such a waiver would be equitable

1	due to a lack of available financial resources at the local
2	level.
3	"SEC. 116. LIMITATIONS ON USES OF FUNDS.
4	"Not more than 5 percent of the amount of assistance
5	received by an applicant in a fiscal year may be used to
6	pay for administrative costs, in accordance with such
7	standards as the Corporation may issue.".
8	SEC. 1202. HIGHER EDUCATION PROVISIONS.
9	Section 119 (42 U.S.C. 12561) is amended by striking
10	subsections (c) through (g) and inserting the following:
11	"(c) Special Consideration.—To the extent prac-
12	ticable, the Corporation shall give special consideration to
13	applications submitted by Historically Black Colleges and
14	Universities, Hispanic-serving institutions, and Tribal Col-
15	leges and Universities.
16	"(d) Federal, State, and Local Contributions.—
17	"(1) Federal share.—
18	"(A) In general.—The Federal share of
19	the cost of carrying out a program for which a
20	grant is made under this part may not exceed 50
21	percent of the total cost of the program.
22	"(B) Non-federal contribution.—In
23	providing for the remaining share of the cost of
24	carrying out such a program, each recipient of
25	a grant under this part—

1	"(i) shall provide for such share
2	through a payment in cash or in kind, fair-
3	ly evaluated, including facilities, equip-
4	ment, or services; and
5	"(ii) may provide for such share
6	through State sources or local sources.
7	"(2) Waiver.—The Chief Executive Officer may
8	waive the requirements of subsection (a) in whole or
9	in part with respect to any such program in any fis-
10	cal year if the Corporation determines that such a
11	waiver would be equitable due to a lack of available
12	financial resources at the local level.
13	"(e) Application for Grant.—
14	"(1) Submission.—To receive a grant or enter
15	into a contract under this part, an applicant shall
16	prepare, submit to the Corporation, and obtain ap-
17	proval of, an application at such time, in such man-
18	ner, and containing such information and assurances
19	as the Corporation may reasonably require. In re-
20	questing applications for assistance under this part,
21	the Corporation shall specify such required informa-
22	tion and assurances.
23	"(2) Contents.—An application submitted
24	under paragraph (1) shall contain, at a minimum—
25	"(A) assurances that—

1	"(i) prior to the placement of a partic-
2	ipant, the applicant will consult with the
3	appropriate local labor organization, if
4	any, representing employees in the area who
5	are engaged in the same or similar work as
6	that proposed to be carried out by such pro-
7	gram, to prevent the displacement and pro-
8	tect the rights of such employees; and
9	"(ii) the applicant will comply with
10	the nonduplication and nondisplacement
11	provisions of section 177 and the grievance
12	procedures required by section 176; and
13	"(B) such other assurances as the Chief Ex-
14	ecutive Officer may reasonably require.
15	"(f) Priority.—In making grants and entering into
16	contracts under subsection (b), the Corporation shall give
17	priority to applicants that submit applications containing
18	proposals that—
19	"(1) demonstrate the commitment of the institu-
20	tion of higher education, other than by demonstrating
21	the commitment of the students, to supporting the
22	community service projects carried out under the pro-
23	gram;

1	"(2) specify the manner in which the institution
2	will promote faculty, administration, and staff par-
3	ticipation in the community service projects;
4	"(3) specify the manner in which the institution
5	will provide service to the community through orga-
6	nized programs, including, where appropriate, clin-
7	ical programs for students in professional schools;
8	"(4) describe any partnership that will partici-
9	pate in the community service projects, such as a
10	partnership comprised of—
11	"(A) the institution;
12	$``(B)(i)\ a\ community\ based\ agency;$
13	"(ii) a local government agency; or
14	"(iii) a non-profit entity that serves or in-
15	volves school-age youth or older adults; and
16	"(C) a student organization;
17	"(5) demonstrate community involvement in the
18	development of the proposal;
19	"(6) describe research designed to identify best
20	practices and other methods to improve service-learn-
21	ing;
22	"(7) specify that the institution will use such as-
23	sistance to strengthen the service infrastructure in in-
24	stitutions of higher education; or

1	"(8) with respect to projects involving delivery of
2	services, specify projects that involve leadership devel-
3	opment of school aged youth.
4	$\hbox{\it ``(g)}\ \ Definition. \hbox{\itNotwith standing section 101 (29)},$
5	as used in this part, the term 'student' means an individual
6	who is enrolled in an institution of higher education on
7	a full- or part-time basis.
8	"(h) Federal Work-Study.—To be eligible for as-
9	sistance under this part, an institution of higher education
10	must demonstrate that it meets the minimum requirements
11	under section 443(b)(2)(B) of the Higher Education Act of
