Mr. Young of Alaska (for himself, Mr. Hansen, Mr. Gilchrest, and Mr. Saxton) introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Resources

## A BILL

To reauthorize the Hydrographic Services Improvement Act of 1998, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This title may be cited as the "Hydrographic Services
- 5 Improvement Act Amendments of 2002".
- 6 SEC. 2. DEFINITIONS.
- 7 Section 302 of the Hydrographic Services Improve-
- 8 ment Act of 1998 (33 U.S.C. 892) is amended—
- 9 (1) in paragraph (3) by inserting "geospatial or
- 10 geomagnetic" after "geodetic"; and

- 1 (2) in paragraph (4) by inserting "geospatial,
- 2 geomagnetic," after "geodetic,".

## 3 SEC. 3. FUNCTIONS OF ADMINISTRATOR.

- 4 (a) Hydrographic Monitoring Systems.—Sec-
- 5 tion 303(b)(4) of the Hydrographic Services Improvement
- 6 Act of 1998 (33 U.S.C. 892a(b)(4)) is amended to read
- 7 as follows:
- 8 "(4) shall design, install, maintain, and operate
- 9 real-time hydrographic monitoring systems to en-
- hance navigation safety and efficiency.".
- 11 (b) Conservation and Management of Coastal
- 12 AND OCEAN RESOURCES.—Section 303 of such Act (33
- 13 U.S.C. 892a) is further amended by adding at the end
- 14 the following:
- 15 "(c) Conservation and Management of Coastal
- 16 AND OCEAN RESOURCES.—Where appropriate and to the
- 17 extent that it does not detract from the promotion of safe
- 18 and efficient navigation, the Secretary may use hydro-
- 19 graphic data and services to support the conservation and
- 20 management of coastal and ocean resources.".
- 21 SEC. 4. QUALITY ASSURANCE PROGRAM.
- 22 (a) In General.—Section 304(b)(1) of the Hydro-
- 23 graphic Services Improvement Act of 1998 (33 U.S.C.
- 24 892b(1)) is amended to read as follows:
- 25 "(1) IN GENERAL.—The Administrator—

"(A) by not later than 2 years after the 1 2 date of enactment of the Hydrographic Services Improvement Act Amendments of 2002, shall, 3 4 subject to the availability of appropriations, de-5 velop and implement a quality assurance pro-6 gram that is equally available to all applicants, 7 under which the Administrator may certify hy-8 drographic products that satisfy the standards 9 promulgated by the Administrator under section 10 303(a)(3) of this Act; 11 "(B) may authorize the use of the emblem 12 or any trademark of the Administration on a 13 hydrographic product certified under subpara-14 graph (A); and "(C) may charge a fee for such certifi-15 cation and use.". 16 17 (b) ACCEPTANCE AND RECOGNITION OF CERTIFI-CATIONS.—Section 304(b) of such Act (33 U.S.C. 18 19 892b(b)) is amended by adding at the end the following: 20 "(3) ACCEPTANCE AND RECOGNITION OF CER-21 TIFICATIONS.—The Administrator shall, to the max-22 imum extent practicable, assure that any inter-

national organizations and agreements to which the

United States is a party which affect hydrographic

products and nautical charts accept or recognize, re-

spectively, hydrographic products certified by the 1 2 Administrator under this subsection.". 3 SEC. 5. HYDROGRAPHIC SERVICES REVIEW PANEL. 4 Section 305 of the Hydrographic Services Improvement Act of 1998 (33 U.S.C. 892c) is amended to read as follows: 6 7 "SEC. 305. HYDROGRAPHIC SERVICES REVIEW PANEL. 8 "(a) Establishment.—No later than 1 year after the date of enactment of the Hydrographic Services Im-10 provement Act Amendments of 2002, the Secretary shall establish the Hydrographic Services Review Panel. 12 "(b) Duties.— 13 "(1) IN GENERAL.—The panel shall advise the 14 Administrator on matters related to the responsibil-15 ities and authorities set forth in section 303 of this 16 Act and such other appropriate matters as the Ad-17 ministrator refers to the panel for review and advice. 18 "(2) Administrative resources.—The Ad-19 ministrator shall make available to the panel such 20 information, personnel, and administrative services 21 and assistance as it may reasonably require to carry 22 out its duties. 23 "(c) Membership.— "(1) In General.— 24

"(A) The panel shall consist of 15 voting 1 2 members who shall be appointed by the Admin-3 istrator. The Director of the Joint Hydro-4 graphic Institute and no more than 2 employees 5 of the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Ad-6 ministration appointed by the Administrator 7 shall serve as nonvoting members of the panel. 8 The voting members of the panel shall be indi-9 viduals who, by reason of knowledge, experience, or training, are especially qualified in one 10 or more of the disciplines and fields relating to 12 hydrographic surveying, tide, current geodetic 13 and geospatial measurement, marine transpor-14 tation, port administration, vessel pilotage, and 15 coastal and fishery management.

> "(B) An individual may not be appointed as a voting member of the panel if the individual is a full-time officer or employee of the United States.

> "(C) Any voting member of the panel who is an applicant for, or beneficiary (as determined by the Secretary) of, any assistance under this Act shall disclose to the panel that relationship, and may not vote on any matter pertaining to that assistance.

1	"(2) TERMS.—
2	"(A) The term of office of a voting mem-
3	ber of the panel shall be 4 years, except that of
4	the original appointees, five shall be appointed
5	for a term of 2 years, five shall be appointed
6	for a term of 3 years, and five shall be ap-
7	pointed for a term of 4 years, as specified by
8	the Administrator at the time of appointment.
9	"(B) Any individual appointed to a partial
10	or full term may be reappointed for one addi-
11	tional full term. A voting member may serve
12	after the date of the expiration of the term of
13	office for which appointed until his or her suc-
14	cessor has taken office.
15	"(3) Nominations.—At least once each year,
16	the Secretary shall publish a notice in the Federal
17	Register soliciting nominations for membership on
18	the panel.
19	"(4) Chairman and vice chairman.—
20	"(A) The panel shall select one voting
21	member to serve as the Chairman and another
22	voting member to serve as the Vice Chairman.
23	"(B) The Vice Chairman shall act as
24	Chairman in the absence or incapacity of the

Chairman.

1	"(d) Compensation.—Voting members of the panel
2	shall—
3	"(1) receive compensation at a rate established
4	by the Secretary, not to exceed the maximum daily
5	rate payable under section 5376 of title 5, United
6	States Code, when actually engaged in the perform-
7	ance of duties for such panel; and
8	"(2) be reimbursed for actual and reasonable
9	expenses incurred in the performance of such duties.
10	"(e) Meetings.—The panel shall meet on a biannual
11	basis and, at any other time, at the call of the Chairman
12	or upon the request of a majority of the voting members
13	or of the Secretary.
14	"(f) Powers.—The panel may exercise such powers
15	as are reasonably necessary in order to carry out its duties
16	under subsection (b).".

- 17 SEC. 6. PLAN REGARDING PHOTOGRAMMETRY AND RE-
- 18 **MOTE SENSING.**
- 19 (a) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 6 months after the
- 20 date of enactment of this Act, the Administrator of the
- 21 National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration shall
- 22 submit to the Congress a plan for increasing, consistent
- 23 with this Act, contracting with the private sector for pho-
- 24 togrammetric, remote sensing, and other geospatial ref-
- 25 erence services related to hydrographic data acquisition or

- 1 hydrographic services activities performed by the National
- 2 Ocean Service. In preparing the plan, the Administrator
- 3 shall consult with private sector entities knowledgeable in
- 4 photogrammetry and remote sensing.
- 5 (b) CONTENTS.—The plan shall include the following:
- 6 (1) An assessment of which of the photo7 grammetric, remote sensing, and other geospatial
  8 reference services related to hydrographic data ac9 quisition or hydrographic services activities per10 formed by the National Ocean Service can be per11 formed adequately by private-sector entities.
  - (2) An evaluation of the relative cost-effectiveness of the Federal Government and private-sector entities in performing those activities.
  - (3) A strategy for enhancing and improving the acquisition and contract management capabilities of the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration to assist in the utilization of private sector entities for photogrammetric, remote sensing and other geospatial reference services related to hydrographic data acquisition or hydrographic services activities performed by the National Ocean Service, including—
