A BILL

To authorize additional funding for the National Security Education Program, to establish the National Flagship Language Initiative under such Program, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

1 **SECTION 1. INCREASE IN AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIA-**
2 **TIONS FOR THE NATIONAL SECURITY EDU-**
3 **CATION PROGRAM FOR FISCAL YEARS 2003**
4 **THROUGH 2007.**

5 Section 810 of the David L. Boren National Security
6 Education Act of 1991 (50 U.S.C. 1910) is amended by
7 adding at the end the following new subsection:

8 “(c) FISCAL YEARS 2003 THROUGH 2007.—(1)

9 There is authorized to be appropriated to the Fund—

10 “(A) for fiscal year 2003, \$10,000,000, and

11 “(B) for each of fiscal years 2004, 2005, 2006,
12 and 2007, \$15,000,000.

13 “(2) Amounts made available for obligation from the
14 Fund for fiscal years 2003 through 2007 shall remain
15 available until expended.”.

16 **SEC. 2. EXPANSION OF NATIONAL SECURITY EDUCATION**
17 **GRANT PROGRAM TO ESTABLISH A NA-**
18 **TIONAL FLAGSHIP LANGUAGE INITIATIVE.**

19 (a) NATIONAL FLAGSHIP LANGUAGE INITIATIVE.—

20 Subsection (a)(1)(C) of section 802 of the David L. Boren
21 National Security Education Act of 1991 (50 U.S.C.
22 1902) is amended—

23 (1) by inserting “(i)” before “foreign lan-
24 guages”; and

25 (2) by inserting before the period the following:

26 “, and (ii) training students in programs in a range

1 of disciplines with advanced levels of proficiency in
2 those foreign languages that the Secretary identifies
3 as being the most critical in the interests of the na-
4 tional security of the United States, such programs
5 to be known as the ‘National Flagship Language
6 Initiative’ ”.

7 (b) WAIVER OF FUNDING ALLOCATION RULES.—
8 Subsection (a)(2) of such section is amended—

9 (1) in subparagraph (C), by striking “(1)(C)”
10 and inserting “(1)(C)(i)”; and

11 (2) by adding at the end the following flush
12 sentence:

13 “The funding allocation under this paragraph shall
14 not apply to the National Flagship Language Initia-
15 tive under paragraph (1)(C)(ii). For authorization of
16 appropriations for such initiative, see section
17 810(c)(2).”.

18 (c) SPECIAL CONSIDERATION FOR FEDERAL EM-
19 PLOYEES.—Subsection (d) of such section is amended by
20 adding at the end the following: “An institution of higher
21 education that receives a grant pursuant to the National
22 Flagship Language Initiative under subsection
23 (a)(1)(C)(ii) shall give special consideration to applicants
24 to the grant program who are employees of the Federal
25 Government.”.

1 (d) CONFORMING AMENDMENT.—Section
2 804(d)(4)(C) of such Act (50 U.S.C. 1904(d)(4)(C)) is
3 amended by inserting “clause (i) of” before “section
4 802(a)(1)(C)”.

5 (e) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendments made by
6 this section shall apply with respect to scholarships and
7 fellowships awarded on or after the date of the enactment
8 of this Act.

9 **SEC. 3. AUTHORITY TO FULFILL SERVICE REQUIREMENTS**
10 **FOR NATIONAL SECURITY EDUCATION PRO-**
11 **GRAM SCHOLARSHIPS AND FELLOWSHIPS IN**
12 **ANY AGENCY OR DEPARTMENT OF THE**
13 **UNITED STATES.**

14 (a) SCHOLARSHIPS.—

15 (1) IN GENERAL.—Subsection (a)(1)(A)(ii) of
16 section 802 of the David L. Boren National Security
17 Education Act of 1991 (50 U.S.C. 1902) is amended
18 by inserting “, work in a position in any other de-
19 partment, agency, or entity of the Federal Govern-
20 ment,” after “work in a national security position”.

21 (2) CONFORMING AMENDMENT.—Subsection
22 (b)(2)(A)(ii) of such section is amended by inserting
23 “, work in a position in any other department, agen-
24 cy, or entity of the Federal Government, or” after
25 “no national security position is available”.

1 (b) FELLOWSHIPS.—

2 (1) IN GENERAL.—Subsection (a)(1)(B)(ii) of
3 such section is amended by inserting “, work in a
4 position in any other department, agency, or entity
5 of the Federal Government,” after “work in a na-
6 tional security position”.

7 (2) CONFORMING AMENDMENT.—Subsection
8 (b)(2)(B)(ii) of such section is amended by inserting
9 “, work in a position in any other department, agen-
10 cy, or entity of the Federal Government, or” after
11 “no national security position is available upon the
12 completion of the degree,”.

13 (c) EFFECTIVE DATE.—(1) Subject to paragraph (2),
14 the amendments made by this section shall apply with re-
15 spect to scholarships and fellowships awarded before, on,
16 or after the date of the enactment of this Act.

17 (2) In the case of scholarships and fellowships award-
18 ed before the date of the enactment of this Act, such
19 amendments shall apply to individuals who have not com-
20 pleted, as of such date, the work component of the service
21 agreement required under subsection (b) of such section
22 802.
