## A BILL

To amend the Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and Emergency Assistance Act to modify the terms of the community disaster loan program, and for other purposes.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2       *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3       **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4       This Act may be cited as the “Community Disaster  
5       Loan Equity Act of 2002”.

6       **SEC. 2. FINDINGS.**

7       Congress finds the following:

1           (1) Major disasters, including disasters caused  
2 by terrorist acts, often result in a decline in eco-  
3 nomic activity in areas affected by the disaster and  
4 a reduction in tax collections by State and local gov-  
5 ernments serving those areas.

6           (2) A report of the General Accounting Office  
7 entitled “Review of the Estimates for the Impact of  
8 the September 11, 2001, Terrorist Attacks on New  
9 York Tax Revenues”, dated July 26, 2002, esti-  
10 mates that—

11                   (A) for fiscal year 2002, tax revenue losses  
12 for New York City will be \$1,600,000,000 and  
13 tax revenue losses for the State of New York  
14 will be \$1,600,000,000; and

15                   (B) for fiscal year 2003, tax revenue losses  
16 for New York City will be \$1,400,000,000 and  
17 tax revenue losses for the State of New York  
18 will be \$4,200,000,000.

19           (3) As a result of the major disaster caused by  
20 terrorist attacks of September 11, 2001, the City of  
21 New York also experienced substantial additional  
22 unreimbursed disaster-related expenses of  
23 \$650,000,000.

24           (4) Under the community disaster loan program  
25 (in this section referred to as the “CDL program”),

1 as authorized by the Robert T. Stafford Disaster  
2 Relief and Emergency Assistance Act, the President  
3 may make loans to a local government suffering a  
4 substantial loss of tax and other revenues as a result  
5 of a major disaster, if the local government dem-  
6 onstrates a need for financial assistance in order to  
7 preform its governmental function.

8 (5) The President may cancel the repayment of  
9 all or any part of a loan made to a local government  
10 under the CDL program if revenues following the  
11 disaster are insufficient to meet the operating budg-  
12 et of that local government as a result of disaster-  
13 related revenue losses and additional unreimbursed  
14 disaster-related municipal operating expenses. In the  
15 case of a major disaster resulting from a terrorist  
16 attack, repayment of interest or principal on a loan  
17 made under the CDL program should not be re-  
18 quired.

19 (6) Assistance made available under the CDL  
20 program is often instrumental in aiding the full re-  
21 covery of a local government following a major dis-  
22 aster.

23 (7) The Disaster Mitigation Act of 2000 estab-  
24 lished a \$5,000,000 limitation on loans made to a  
25 local government under the CDL program in connec-

1       tion with a major disaster. Before the date of enact-  
2       ment of such Act, there was not any limitation on  
3       the amount of such loans.

4               (8) The \$5,000,000 limitation is inequitable  
5       when applied to a local government serving a largely  
6       populated area, such as New York City, and is in-  
7       consistent with the objective of the CDL program to  
8       provide meaningful assistance to a local government  
9       recovering from a major disaster.

10 **SEC. 3. COMMUNITY DISASTER LOANS.**

11       (a) **ELIGIBILITY OF STATES.**—Section 417 of the  
12 Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and Emergency Assist-  
13 ance Act (42 U.S.C. 5184) is amended by striking “local  
14 government” each place it appears and inserting “State  
15 or local government”.

16       (b) **AMOUNT.**—Section 417(b) of such Act (42 U.S.C.  
17 5184(b)) is amended—

18               (1) by striking “based on need, shall” and in-  
19       serting “based on need and shall”; and

20               (2) by striking “, and shall not exceed  
21       \$5,000,000”.

22       (c) **MAJOR DISASTERS CAUSED BY TERRORIST AT-**  
23 **TACKS.**—Section 417 of such Act (42 U.S.C. 5184) is  
24 amended by adding at the end the following:

1       “(e) MAJOR DISASTERS CAUSED BY TERRORIST AT-  
2 TACKS.—The President shall not require the payment of  
3 any interest or principal on a loan made under this section  
4 to a State or local government which may suffer a sub-  
5 stantial loss of tax and other revenues as a result of a  
6 major disaster caused by a terrorist attack.”.

7       (d) APPLICABILITY.—The amendments made by this  
8 section shall apply with respect to any major disaster oc-  
9 ccurring on or after October 30, 2000.
