Mrs. WILSON of New Mexico (for herself and Mr. PICKERING) introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Judiciary

A BILL

To amend title 18, United States Code, to provide mandatory restitution in certain cases, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Mandatory Restitution
5 for Corporate Abuses Act of 2002”.

6 **SEC. 2. MANDATORY RESTITUTION.**

7 (a) IN GENERAL.—Chapter 63 of title 18, United
8 States Code, is amended by adding at the end the fol-
9 lowing:

1 **“§1351. Mandatory restitution for certain offenses**

2 “(a) IN GENERAL.—Notwithstanding section 3663 or
3 3663A, and in addition to any other civil or criminal pen-
4 alty authorized by law, the court shall order restitution
5 to all victims of any offense under section 1341, 1342,
6 1343, 1344, or 1348.

7 “(b) SCOPE AND NATURE OF ORDER.—

8 “(1) DIRECTIONS.—The order of restitution
9 under this section shall direct the defendant to pay
10 to the victim (through the appropriate court mecha-
11 nism) the full amount of the victim’s losses as deter-
12 mined by the court pursuant to paragraph (2).

13 “(2) ENFORCEMENT.—An order of restitution
14 under this section shall be issued and enforced in ac-
15 cordance with section 3664 in the same manner as
16 an order under section 3663A.

17 “(3) DEFINITION.—For purposes of this sub-
18 section, the term “full amount of the victim’s losses”
19 means all losses suffered by the victim as a proxi-
20 mate result of the offense.

21 “(4) ORDER MANDATORY.—(A) The issuance of
22 a restitution order under this section is mandatory.

23 “(B) A court may not decline to issue an order
24 under this section because of—

25 “(i) the economic circumstances of the de-
26 fendant; or

1 “(ii) the fact that a victim has, or is enti-
2 tled to, receive compensation for his or her inju-
3 ries from the proceeds of insurance or any other
4 source.

5 “(c) VICTIM DEFINED.—In this section, the term
6 ‘victim’ has the meaning given that term in section
7 3663A(a)(2).”.

8 (b) CLERICAL AMENDMENT.—The table of sections
9 at the beginning of chapter 63 of title 18, United States
10 Code, is amended by adding at the end the following new
11 item:

“1351. Mandatory restitution for certain offenses.”.

12 **SEC. 3. NONDISCHARGEABILITY OF RESTITUTION OR-**
13 **DERED UNDER CRIMINAL LAW OF STATES.**

14 Section 523(a)(13) of title 11, United States Code,
15 is amended by striking “, United States Code” and insert-
16 ing “or under the criminal law of a State” after “title
17 18”.
