3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Protecting Priorities
- 5 and Restoring Budget Disciplines Act of 2002".

3 Upon the enactment of this Act, the Director of the 4 Office of Management and Budget shall reduce any bal-5 ances of direct spending and receipts legislation for fiscal 6 years 2002 and 2003 under section 252 of the Balanced 7 Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985 to 8 zero.

9 SEC. 3. EXTENSION OF PAY-AS-YOU-GO REQUIREMENT.

Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985 is amended by

16 (b) EXPIRATION.—Section 275(b) of the Balanced
17 Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985 is

(1) 1106(c) of title 31, United States Code," and by inserting ", sections 1105(f) and 1106(c) of title 31,
United States Code, shall expire September 30,
2007" after "2002"; and

1SEC. 4. SENSE OF CONGRESS ON EXTENSION OF DISCRE-2TIONARY SPENDING LIMITS.

3 It is the sense of Congress that, in recognition of the 4 valuable role that discretionary spending limits have 5 played in maintaining fiscal discipline and setting budg-6 etary priorities, Congress and the President should agree 7 upon an extension of the discretionary spending limits by 8 establishing caps for fiscal years 2003 through 2007.

9 SEC. 5. EXTENSION OF DISCRETIONARY SPENDING LIMITS.

10 The first sentence of section 275(b) of the Balanced 11 Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985 (as amended by section 2) is further amended by striking 12 "251," and ", 258B," and by inserting after "2007" the 13 following: ", and sections 251 and 258B shall expire Sep-14 15 tember 30 of the last fiscal year for which any subsequent 16 extension of the discretionary spending limits set forth in section 251(c) applies". 17
