## A BILL

To make emergency supplemental appropriations for fiscal year 2001 for the Department of Defense.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Defense Emergency  
5 Supplemental Appropriations Act, 2001”.

6 **TITLE I—SUPPLEMENTAL**  
7 **APPROPRIATIONS**

8 The following sums are appropriated, out of any  
9 money in the Treasury not otherwise appropriated, to pro-  
10 vide supplemental appropriations for fiscal year 2001:



1 Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 2001, as en-  
2 acted into law by Public Law 106–398).

3                   MILITARY PERSONNEL, AIR FORCE

4       For an additional amount for “Military Personnel,  
5 Air Force”, \$356,600,000, of which \$500,000 shall be  
6 available only for supplemental subsistence allowances  
7 under section 402a of title 37, United States Code (as  
8 added by section 604 of the Floyd D. Spence National  
9 Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 2001, as en-  
10 acted into law by Public Law 106–398).

11                   RESERVE PERSONNEL, ARMY

12       For an additional amount for “Reserve Personnel,  
13 Army”, \$119,600,000.

14                   RESERVE PERSONNEL, MARINE CORPS

15       For an additional amount for “Reserve Personnel,  
16 Marine Corps”, \$600,000.

17                   NATIONAL GUARD PERSONNEL, ARMY

1 **TITLE II—GENERAL PROVISIONS**

2 **SEC. 201. EMERGENCY DESIGNATION.**

3 Each amount appropriated in this Act—

4 (1) is designated by the Congress as an emer-  
5 gency requirement pursuant to section 251(b)(2)(A)  
6 of the Balanced Budget and Emergency Deficit Con-  
7 trol Act of 1985; and

8 (2) shall be available only to the extent that the  
9 President transmits to the Congress an official  
10 budget request that includes designation of the en-  
11 tire amount of the request as an emergency require-  
12 ment pursuant to such section.
