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## AN ACT

To redesignate certain lands within the Craters of the Moon  
National Monument, and for other purposes.

1        *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2        *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

1 **SECTION 1. SPECIAL MANAGEMENT REQUIREMENTS FOR**  
2 **FEDERAL LANDS RECENTLY ADDED TO CRA-**  
3 **TERS OF THE MOON NATIONAL MONUMENT,**  
4 **IDAHO.**

5 (a) REDESIGNATION.—The approximately 410,000  
6 acres of land added to the Craters of the Moon National  
7 Monument by Presidential Proclamation 7373 of Novem-  
8 ber 9, 2000, and identified on the map accompanying the  
9 Proclamation for administration by the National Park  
10 Service, shall, on and after the date of enactment of this  
11 Act, be known as the “Craters of the Moon National Pre-  
12 serve”.

13 (b) ADMINISTRATION.—

14 (1) IN GENERAL.—Except as provided by para-  
15 graph (2), the Craters of the Moon National Pre-  
16 serve shall be administered in accordance with—

17 (A) Presidential Proclamation 7373 of No-  
18 vember 9, 2000;

19 (B) the Act of June 8, 1906, (commonly  
20 referred to as the “Antiquities Act”; 34 Stat.  
21 225; 16 U.S.C. 431); and

22 (C) the laws generally applicable to units  
23 of the National Park System, including the Act  
24 entitled “An Act to establish a National Park  
25 Service, and for other purposes”, approved Au-  
26 gust 25, 1916 (16 U.S.C. 1 et seq.).

1           (2) HUNTING.—The Secretary of the Interior  
2 shall permit hunting on lands within the Craters of  
3 the Moon National Preserve in accordance with the  
4 applicable laws of the United States and the State  
5 of Idaho. The Secretary, in consultation with the  
6 State of Idaho, may designate zones where, and es-  
7 tablish periods when, no hunting may be permitted  
8 for reasons of public safety, protection of the area’s  
9 resources, administration, or public use and enjoy-  
10 ment. Except in emergencies, any regulations pre-  
11 scribing such restrictions relating to hunting shall be  
12 put into effect only after consultation with the State  
13 of Idaho.
