Mrs. MYRICK, from the Committee on Rules, reported the following resolution; which was referred to the House Calendar and ordered to be printed

RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 3925) to establish an exchange program between the Federal Government and the private sector in order to promote the development of expertise in information technology management, and for other purposes.

1 *Resolved*, That at any time after the adoption of this
2 resolution the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 2(b) of
3 rule XVIII, declare the House resolved into the Committee
4 of the Whole House on the state of the Union for consider-
5 ation of the bill (H.R. 3925) to establish an exchange pro-

1 gram between the Federal Government and the private
2 sector in order to promote the development of expertise
3 in information technology management, and for other pur-
4 poses. The first reading of the bill shall be dispensed with.
5 All points of order against consideration of the bill are
6 waived. General debate shall be confined to the bill and
7 shall not exceed one hour equally divided and controlled
8 by the chairman and ranking minority member of the
9 Committee on Government Reform. After general debate
10 the bill shall be considered for amendment under the five-
11 minute rule. It shall be in order to consider as an original
12 bill for the purpose of amendment under the five-minute
13 rule the amendment in the nature of a substitute rec-
14 ommended by the Committee on Government Reform now
15 printed in the bill, modified by the amendments rec-
16 ommended by the Committee on the Judiciary also printed
17 in the bill. That amendment in the nature of a substitute
18 shall be considered as read. During consideration of the
19 bill for amendment, the Chairman of the Committee of
20 the Whole may accord priority in recognition on the basis
21 of whether the Member offering an amendment has caused
22 it to be printed in the portion of the Congressional Record
23 designated for that purpose in clause 8 of rule XVIII.
24 Amendments so printed shall be considered as read. At
25 the conclusion of consideration of the bill for amendment

1 the Committee shall rise and report the bill to the House
2 with such amendments as may have been adopted. Any
3 Member may demand a separate vote in the House on any
4 amendment adopted in the Committee of the Whole to the
5 bill or to the amendment in the nature of a substitute
6 made in order as original text. The previous question shall
7 be considered as ordered on the bill and amendments
8 thereto to final passage without intervening motion except
9 one motion to recommit with or without instructions.
