Mr. Feingold (for himself and Ms. Collins) introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Health, Education, Labor, and Pensions

A BILL

To establish a program for an information clearinghouse to increase public access to defibrillation in schools.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Automatic
- 5 Defibrillation in Adam's Memory Act", or the "ADAM
- 6 Act".
- 7 SEC. 2. FINDINGS.
- 8 Congress makes the following findings:
- 9 (1) Heart disease is the leading cause of death
- in the United States.

- 1 (2) 220,000 Americans die each year of sudden 2 cardiac arrest.
 - (3) The American Heart Association estimates that the lives of 50,000 cardiac arrest victims could be saved each year through initiating a course of action known as the chain of survival.
 - (4) The chain of survival includes prompt notification of emergency services and early cardiopulmonary resuscitation (referred to in this Act as "CPR"), defibrillation, and advanced cardiac life support.
 - (5) An important part of United States school children's education is learning healthy behaviors, including proper nutrition and physical activity. This health education should also include basic emergency lifesaving skills.
 - (6) Incorporating these lifesaving training programs into the health curriculum of elementary and secondary schools will give school children these skills.
 - (7) Project Automatic Defibrillation in Adam's Memory (ADAM) has been successful in fostering awareness of the potential for cardiac arrest in the childhood and adolescent population, encouraging improvement of screening procedures, and facili-

2	in CPR and the use of automatic external
3	defibrillators (referred to in this Act as "AED").
4	SEC. 3. GRANTS FOR ACCESS TO DEFIBRILLATION.
5	(a) Program Authorized.—The Secretary of
6	Health and Human Services shall award a grant to an
7	organization to establish national information clearing-
8	house that provides information to increase public access
9	to defibrillation in schools.
10	(b) Duties.—The health care organization that re-
11	ceives a grant under this section shall promote public ac-
12	cess to defibrillation in schools by—
13	(1) providing timely information to entities re-
14	garding public access defibrillation program imple-
15	mentation and development;
16	(2) developing and providing comprehensive
17	program materials to establish a public access
18	defibrillation program in schools;
19	(3) providing support to CPR and AED train-
20	ing programs;
21	(4) fostering new and existing community part-
22	nerships with and among public and private organi-
23	zations (such as local educational agencies, nonprofit
24	organizations, public health organizations, emer-

gency medical service providers, fire and police de-

- partments, and parent-teacher associations) to pro mote public access to defibrillation in schools;
- (5) establishing a data base to gather information in a central location regarding sudden cardiac arrest in the pediatric population and identifying or conducting further research into the problem; and
- 7 (6) providing assistance to communities that 8 wish to develop screening programs for at risk 9 youth.
- 10 (c) APPLICATION.—A health care organization desir11 ing a grant under this section shall submit an application
 12 to the Secretary at such time, in such manner, and accom13 panied by such information as the Secretary may reason14 ably require.
- 15 (d) Report.—Not later than 5 years after receipt of a grant under this section, the health care organization 16 17 that receives such grant shall prepare and submit to the 18 Secretary of Health and Human Services a report that 19 describes activities carried out with funds received under this section. Not later than 3 months after receipt of such 20 21 report, the Secretary of Health and Human Services shall prepare and submit to the appropriate committees of Congress an evaluation that reviews such report and evaluates the success of such clearinghouse.

- 1 (e) Authorization of Appropriations.—From
- 2 funds authorized to be appropriated for fiscal years 2002
- 3 through 2006 for activities and programs under the De-
- 4 partment of Health and Human Services, \$800,000 of
- 5 such funds may be appropriated to carry out the programs
- 6 described in this Act for each of the fiscal years 2002

7 through 2006.
