Mr. Roberts (for himself and Mr. Brownback) introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on the Judiciary

A BILL

To establish a commission for the purpose of encouraging and providing for the commemoration of the 50th anniversary of the Supreme Court decision in Brown v. Board of Education.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. FINDINGS.
- 4 Congress finds that as the Nation approaches May
- 5 17, 2004, marking the 50th anniversary of the Supreme
- 6 Court decision in Oliver L. Brown et al. v. Board of Edu-
- 7 cation of Topeka, Kansas et al., it is appropriate to estab-

- 1 lish a national commission to plan and coordinate the com-
- 2 memoration of that anniversary.
- 3 SEC. 2. ESTABLISHMENT.
- 4 There is established a commission to be known as the
- 5 "Brown v. Board of Education 50th Anniversary Commis-
- 6 sion" (referred to in this Act as the "Commission").
- 7 SEC. 3. DUTIES.
- 8 In order to commemorate the 50th anniversary of the
- 9 Brown decision, the Commission shall—
- 10 (1) in conjunction with the Department of Edu-
- 11 cation, plan and coordinate public education activi-
- ties and initiatives, including public lectures, writing
- contests, and public awareness campaigns, through
- the Department of Education's ten regional offices;
- 15 (2) in cooperation with the Brown Foundation
- for Educational Equity, Excellence, and Research in
- 17 Topeka, Kansas, (referred to in this Act as the
- 18 "Brown Foundation") and such other public or pri-
- vate entities as the Commission considers appro-
- priate, encourage, plan, develop, and coordinate ob-
- 21 servances of the anniversary of the Brown decision;
- 22 and
- 23 (3) submit recommendations to the Congress
- relating to a joint session of Congress for the pur-
- pose of commemorating the anniversary.

1 SEC. 4. MEMBERSHIP.

2	(a) Number and Appointment.—The Commission
3	shall be composed as follows:
4	(1) Two representatives of the Department of
5	Education appointed by the Secretary of Education,
6	one of whom shall serve as Chair of the Commission.
7	(2) Eleven individuals appointed by the Presi-
8	dent after receiving recommendations as follows:
9	(A) Members of the Senate from each of
10	the States in which the lawsuits decided by the
11	Brown decision were originally filed, Delaware,
12	Kansas, South Carolina, and Virginia, and from
13	the State of the first legal challenge, Massachu-
14	setts, shall jointly recommend to the President
15	one individual from their respective States.
16	(B) Members of the House of Representa-
17	tives from each of the States referred to in sub-
18	paragraph (A) shall jointly recommend to the
19	President one individual from their respective
20	States.
21	(C) The Delegate to the House of Rep-
22	resentatives from the District of Columbia shall
23	recommend to the President one individual
24	from the District of Columbia.

1	(3) Two representatives of the judicial branch
2	of the Federal Government appointed by the Chief
3	Justice of the United States Supreme Court.
4	(4) Two representatives of the Brown Founda-
5	tion.
6	(5) Two representatives of the NAACP Legal
7	Defense and Education Fund.
8	(6) One representative of the Brown v. Board
9	of Education National Historic Site.
10	(b) Terms.—Members of the Commission shall be
11	appointed for the life of the Commission.
12	(c) Vacancies.—A vacancy in the Commission shall
13	be filled in the same manner as the original appointment.
14	(d) Compensation.—
15	(1) In general.— Members of the Commis-
16	sion shall serve without pay.
17	(2) Travel expenses.—Each member shall
18	receive travel expenses, including per diem in lieu of
19	subsistence, in accordance with applicable provisions
20	under subchapter I of chapter 57 of title 5, United
21	States Code.
22	(e) Quorum.—A majority of members of the Com-
23	mission shall constitute a quorum.
24	(f) Meetings.—The Commission shall hold its first
25	meeting not later than 6 months after the date of enact-

1	ment of this Act. The Commission shall subsequently meet
2	at the call of the Chair or a majority of its members.
3	(g) EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR AND STAFF.— The Com-
4	mission may secure the services of an executive director
5	and staff personnel as it considers appropriate.
6	SEC. 5. POWERS.
7	(a) Powers of Members and Agents.—Any mem-
8	ber or agent of the Commission may, if so authorized by
9	the Commission, take any action which the Commission
10	is authorized to take under this Act.
11	(b) Gifts and Donations.—
12	(1) AUTHORITY TO ACCEPT.—The Commission
13	may accept and use gifts or donations of money,
14	property, or personal services.
15	(2) Disposition of Property.—Any books,
16	manuscripts, miscellaneous printed matter, memora-
17	bilia, relics, or other materials donated to the Com-
18	mission which relate to the Brown decision, shall,
19	upon termination of the Commission—
20	(A) be deposited for preservation in the
21	Brown Foundation Collection at the Spencer
22	Research Library at the University of Kansas
23	in Lawrence, Kansas; or
24	(B) be disposed of by the Commission in
25	consultation with the Librarian of Congress,

- and with the express consent of the Brown
- Foundation and the Brown v. Board of Edu-
- 3 cation National Historic Site.
- 4 (c) Mails.—The Commission may use the United
- 5 States mails in the same manner and under the same con-
- 6 ditions as other departments and agencies of the United
- 7 States.

8 SEC. 6. REPORTS.

- 9 (a) Interim Reports.—The Commission shall
- 10 transmit interim reports to the President and Congress
- 11 not later than December 31 of each year. Each such re-
- 12 port shall include a description of the activities of the
- 13 Commission during the year covered by the report, an ac-
- 14 counting of any funds received or expended by the Com-
- 15 mission during such year, and recommendations for any
- 16 legislation or administrative action which the Commission
- 17 considers appropriate.
- 18 (b) Final Report.—The Commission shall transmit
- 19 a final report to the President and Congress not later than
- 20 December 31, 2004. Such report shall include an account-
- 21 ing of any funds received or expended, and the disposition
- 22 of any other properties, not previously reported.

1 SEC. 7. TERMINATION.

- 2 (a) Date.—The Commission shall terminate on such
- 3 date as the Commission may determine, but not later than
- 4 February 1, 2005.
- 5 (b) DISPOSITION OF FUNDS.—Any funds held by the
- 6 Commission on the date the Commission terminates shall
- 7 be deposited in the general fund of the Treasury.
- 8 SEC. 8. AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.
- 9 There are authorized to be appropriated at total of
- 10 \$300,000 for fiscal years 2003 and 2004 to carry out this
- 11 Act, to remain available until expended.

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
