## A BILL

To amend title 38, United States Code, to facilitate the use of educational assistance under the Montgomery GI Bill for education leading to employment in high technology industry, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

1	SECTION 1. ACCELERATED PAYMENTS OF EDUCATIONAL
2	ASSISTANCE UNDER MONTGOMERY GI BILL
3	FOR EDUCATION LEADING TO EMPLOYMENT
4	IN HIGH TECHNOLOGY INDUSTRY.
5	(a) In General.—(1) Chapter 30 of title 38, United
6	States Code, is amended by inserting after section 3014
7	the following new section:
8	"§ 3014A. Accelerated payment of basic educational
9	assistance for education leading to em-
0	ployment in high technology industry
1	"(a) An individual described in subsection (b) who
2	is entitled to basic educational assistance under this sub-
3	chapter may elect to receive an accelerated payment of the
4	basic educational assistance allowance otherwise payable
5	to the individual under section 3015 of this title.
6	"(b) An individual described in this subsection is an
7	individual who is—
8	"(1) enrolled in an approved program of edu-
9	cation that leads to employment in a high technology
20	industry (as determined pursuant to regulations pre-
21	scribed by the Secretary); and
22	"(2) charged tuition and fees for the program
23	of education that, when divided by the number of
24	months (and fractions thereof) in the enrollment pe-
25	riod, exceeds the amount equal to 200 percent of the
26	monthly rate of basic educational assistance allow-

1	ance otherwise payable to the individual under sec-
2	tion 3015 of this title.
3	"(e)(1) The amount of the accelerated payment of
4	basic educational assistance made to an individual making
5	an election under subsection (a) for a program of edu-
6	eation shall be the lesser of—
7	"(A) the amount equal to 60 percent of the es-
8	tablished charges for the program of education; or
9	"(B) the aggregate amount of basic educational
10	assistance to which the individual remains entitled
11	under this chapter at the time of the payment.
12	"(2) In this subsection, the term 'established
13	charges', in the case of a program of education, means
14	the actual charges (as determined pursuant to regulations
15	prescribed by the Secretary) for tuition and fees which
16	similarly circumstanced nonveterans enrolled in the pro-
17	gram of education would be required to pay. Established
18	charges shall be determined on the following basis:
19	"(A) In the case of an individual enrolled in a
20	program of education offered on a term, quarter, or
21	semester basis, the tuition and fees charged the indi-
22	vidual for the term, quarter, or semester.
23	"(B) In the case of an individual enrolled in a
24	program of education not offered on a term, quarter,

- 1 or semester basis, the tuition and fees charged the
- 2 individual for the entire program of education.
- 3 "(3) The educational institution providing the pro-
- 4 gram of education for which an accelerated payment of
- 5 basic educational assistance allowance is elected by an in-
- 6 dividual under subsection (a) shall certify to the Secretary
- 7 the amount of the established charges for the program of
- 8 education.
- 9 "(d) An accelerated payment of basic educational as-
- 10 sistance made to an individual under this section for a
- 11 program of education shall be made not later than the last
- 12 day of the month immediately following the month in
- 13 which the Secretary receives a certification from the edu-
- 14 cational institution providing the program of education of
- 15 the individual's enrollment in and pursuit of the program
- 16 of education.
- 17 "(e)(1) Except as provided in paragraph (2), for each
- 18 accelerated payment of basic educational assistance made
- 19 to an individual under this section, the individual's entitle-
- 20 ment to basic educational assistance under this chapter
- 21 shall be charged the number of months (and any fraction)
- 22 thereof) determined by dividing the amount of the acceler-
- 23 ated payment by the full-time monthly rate of basic edu-
- 24 eational assistance allowance otherwise payable to the in-
- 25 dividual under section 3015 of this title as of the begin-

- 1 ning date of the enrollment period for the program of edu-
- 2 cation for which the accelerated payment is made.
- 3 "(2) If the monthly rate of basic educational assist-
- 4 ance allowance otherwise payable to an individual under
- 5 section 3015 of this title increases during the enrollment
- 6 period of a program of education for which an accelerated
- 7 payment of basic educational assistance is made under
- 8 this section, the individual's entitlement to basic edu-
- 9 cational assistance under this chapter shall be charged the
- 10 number of months (and any fraction thereof) determined
- 11 by computing the portion of the accelerated payment at-
- 12 <del>tributable to each monthly rate that would have payable</del>
- 13 for the enrollment, dividing each such portion by the appli-
- 14 cable monthly rate, and adding the results together.
- 15 "(f) The Secretary may, pursuant to such regulations
- 16 as the Secretary shall prescribe, recover overpayments of
- 17 basic educational assistance under this chapter resulting
- 18 from accelerated payments of basic educational assistance
- 19 under this section.
- 20 "(g) The Secretary shall prescribe regulations to
- 21 earry out this section. The regulations shall include re-
- 22 quirements, conditions, and methods for electing and
- 23 using accelerated payments of basic educational assistance
- 24 under this section and for the recovery of overpayments
- 25 of basic educational assistance under this chapter result-

- 1 ing from accelerated payments of basic educational assist-
- 2 ance under this section.".
- 3 (2) The table of sections at the beginning of that
- 4 chapter is amended by inserting after the item relating
- 5 to section 3014 the following new item:
  - "3014A. Accelerated payment of basic educational assistance for education leading to employment in high technology industry.".
- 6 (b) RESTATEMENT AND EXPANSION OF CERTAIN AD-
- 7 MINISTRATIVE AUTHORITIES.—Subsection (g) of section
- 8 3680 of title 38, United States Code, is amended to read
- 9 as follows:
- 10 "(g)(1) The Secretary may, pursuant to regulations
- 11 which the Secretary shall prescribe, determine and define
- 12 with respect to an eligible veteran and eligible person the
- 13 following:
- 14 "(A) Enrollment in a course or a program of
- 15 education or training.
- 16 "(B) Pursuit of a course or program of edu-
- 17 <u>cation or training.</u>
- 18 "(C) Attendance at a course or program of edu-
- 19 cation and training.
- 20 "(2) The Secretary may withhold payment of benefits
- 21 to an eligible veteran or eligible person until the Secretary
- 22 receives such proof as the Secretary may require of enroll-
- 23 ment in and satisfactory pursuit of a program of education
- 24 by the eligible veteran or eligible person. The Secretary

- 1 shall adjust the payment withheld, when necessary, on the

- 3 "(3) In the ease of an individual other than an indi-
- 4 vidual described in paragraph (4), the Secretary may ac-
- 5 cept the individual's monthly certification of enrollment in
- 6 and satisfactory pursuit of a program of education as suf-
- 7 ficient proof of the certified matters.
- 8 "(4) In the case of an individual who has received
- 9 an accelerated payment of basic educational assistance
- 10 under section 3014A of this title during an enrollment pe-
- 11 riod for a program of education, the Secretary may accept
- 12 the individual's certification of enrollment in and satisfac-
- 13 tory pursuit of the program of education as sufficient
- 14 proof of the certified matters if the certification is sub-
- 15 mitted after the enrollment period has ended.".
- 16 (e) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendments made by
- 17 this section shall take effect eight months after the date
- 18 of the enactment of this Act, and shall apply with respect
- 19 to enrollments in courses or programs of education or
- 20 training beginning on or after that date.

- 4 directly or under an agreement with another entity (that

- 7 generally recognized as necessary to obtain, maintain, or
- 8 advance in employment in a profession or vocation in a

- 15 titled to basic educational assistance under this subchapter
- 16 may elect to receive an accelerated payment of the basic
- 17 educational assistance allowance.
- 18 "(B) The Secretary may not make an accelerated pay-
- 19 ment under this subsection for a course to an individual
- 20 who has received an advance payment under section 3014A
- 21 or 3680(d) of this title for the same enrollment period.
- 22 "(2)(A) Pursuant to an election under paragraph (1),
- 23 the Secretary shall make an accelerated payment to an in-

16	3015(h) of this title in the monthly rate of basic educational

19	shall pay—
20	"(i) on an accelerated basis the amount of the al-
21	lowance otherwise payable under this subchapter for
22	the period without regard to the adjustment under
23	that section; and

- 2 tional amount of the allowance that is payable for the
