shall consider, with respect to each offense described in

3 (1) any expression of congressional intent re-4 garding the appropriate penalties for the offense; 5 (2) the range of conduct covered by the offense; 6 (3) the existing sentences for the offense; 7 (4) the extent to which sentencing enhance-8 ments within the Federal sentencing guidelines and 9 the authority of the court to impose a sentence in 10 excess of the applicable guideline range are adequate 11 to ensure punishment at or near the maximum pen-12 alty for the most egregious conduct covered by the 13 offense: 14 (5) the extent to which the Federal sentencing

15 guideline sentences for the offense have been con-16 strained by statutory maximum penalties;

(6) the extent to which the Federal sentencing
guidelines for the offense adequately achieve the

guidelines for other offenses of comparable seriousness; and

(8) any other factors that the Commission con siders to be appropriate.

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
