# A BILL

- To provide for the expeditious completion of the acquisition of State of Wyoming lands within the boundaries of Grand Teton National Park, and for other purposes.
  - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
  - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

### 1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

2 This Act mat be cited as the "Grand Teton National
3 Park Land Exchange Act".

4 SEC. 2. DEFINITIONS.

5 (a) The term "Governor" means the Governor of the
6 State of Wyoming.

7 (b) The term "Secretary" means the Secretary of the
8 Department of the Interior.

9 (c) The term "State lands" means the State of Wyo-10 ming lands, and interest therein, within the boundaries of 11 Grand Teton National Park as identified on a map titled 12 "Private, State & County Inholdings Grand Teton Na-13 tional Park", dated March 2001, and numbered "GTNP-14 0001".

#### 15 SEC. 3. PURPOSE AND INTENT.

16 The purpose of this Act is to authorize the Secretary 17 to acquire approximately 1,406 acres of State lands and 18 interests therein within the exterior boundaries of Grand 19 Teton National Park.

# 20 SEC. 4. VALUATION OF INTEREST.

21 (a) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 90 days after the
22 date of enactment of this Act the State lands to be ac23 quired shall be valued by one of the following methods:
24 (1) SELECTION OF APPRAISER.—The Secretary
25 and the Governor shall mutually agree on the selec-

tion of a qualified appraiser to conduct an appraisal of the State lands.

3 (2) NO AGREEMENT ON APPRAISER. If no appraiser is mutually agreed to under paragraph (a)(1)
of this section, the Secretary and the Governor shall
each designate a qualified appraiser, and the two
designated appraisers shall select a third qualified
appraiser to perform the appraisal with the advice
and assistance of the designated appraisers.

10 (3) FAILURE OF PROCESS.—If the Secretary 11 and the Governor eannot agree on the evaluation of 12 the appraised State lands by the date that is 180 13 days after the date of enactment of this section the 14 Governor may petition the United States Court of 15 Federal Claims for a determination of the value of 16 the State lands and interest therein. Subject to the 17 right of appeal, a determination by the Court shall 18 be binding for purposes of this section on all parties.

# 19 SEC. 5. LAND EXCHANGE.

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20 (a) DUTIES OF THE SECRETARY.

21 (1) Within 180 days after the value of the State
22 lands is determined in accordance with the provi23 sions of section 4 of this Act, the Secretary, in con24 sultation with the Governor, shall exchange Federal

1	lands of equal value or other Federal assets of equal
2	value, or a combination of both, for the State lands.
3	(2) Upon final exchange of title between the
4	State and the Secretary, the lands conveyed to the
5	United States pursuant to this Act shall become
6	part of Grand Teton National Park. Once conveyed,
7	such lands shall be managed in accordance with the
8	Act of August 25, 1916 (commonly known as the
9	"National Park Service Organic Act"), and in ac-
10	cordance with the other laws, rules and regulations
11	applicable to the National Park System.

8 The purpose of this Act is to authorize the Secretary 9 to acquire approximately 1,406 acres of State lands and 10 interests therein within the exterior boundaries of Grand 11 Teton National Park.

### 12 SEC. 4. VALUATION OF INTEREST.

Not later than 90 days after the date of enactment of
this Act, the State lands to be acquired shall be valued by

19 of the State lands.

20 (2) NO AGREEMENT ON APPRAISER.—If no appraiser is mutually agreed to under paragraph (1),

5 appraised State lands by the date that is 180 days
6 after the date of enactment of this section the Gov7 ernor may petition the United States Court of Fed8 eral Claims for a determination by the Court shall be
9 binding for purposes of this section on all parties.

### 10 SEC. 5. LAND EXCHANGE.

11 Within 180 days after the value of the state lands is 12 determined in accordance with the provisions of section 4 13 of this Act, the Secretary, in consultation with the Gov-14 ernor, shall exchange Federal lands of equal value or other 15 Federal assets of equal value, or a combination of both, for 16 the State lands.

### 17 SEC. 6. ADMINISTRATION OF ACQUIRED LANDS.

18 Upon final exchange of title between the State and the 19 secretary, the lands conveyed to the United States pursuant to this Act shall become part of Grand Teton National Park. 20 21 Once conveyed, such lands shall be managed in accordance 22 with the Act of August 25, 1916 (commonly known as the 23 "National Park Service Organic Act") and other laws, rules 24 and regulations applicable to units of the National Park System. 25

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
