## A BILL

To provide for national digital school districts.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
  3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
  4 This Act may be cited as the "National Digital School Districts Act".
  5 Sec. 2. NATIONAL DIGITAL SCHOOL DISTRICTS.
  7 (a) PURPOSES.—The purposes of this section are—
  - (1) to address the important role that technology and the Internet can play in enhancing and improving education in the schools of the United States when resources are allocated strategically and effectively;

- 1 (2) to assist State and local school administra-2 tors in the United States in effectively devoting re-3 sources on proven methods to incorporate the use of 4 high technology and the Internet in educational cur-5 ricula;
  - (3) to encourage the development of innovative strategic approaches to the appropriate and effective use of technology in teaching, learning, and managing elementary schools and secondary schools;
  - (4) to evaluate and assess the various strategies described in paragraph (3) and provide models for the innovative use of technology in schools in the United States; and
  - (5) to encourage partnerships between educational institutions and the private sector relating to the use of technology described in paragraph (3) in schools in the United States.

## (b) DEFINITIONS.—In this section:

(1) ELEMENTARY AND SECONDARY SCHOOL; STATE AND LOCAL EDUCATIONAL AGENCIES.—The terms "elementary school", "secondary school", State educational agency" and "local educational agency" have the meanings given such terms in the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965 (20 U.S.C. 6301 et seq.).

| 16 | (A) In general.—For fiscal year 2003,                |
| 17 | the Secretary shall award 1 grant to each State      |

- 1 (3) STATE APPLICATIONS.—To be eligible to re2 ceive a grant under this section, a State educational
  3 agency shall submit an application to the Secretary
  4 at such time, in such manner, and containing such
  5 information as the Secretary may reasonably re6 quire.
- 7 (d) Subgrants to Local Educational Agen-8 cies.—
  - (1) Subgrants.—A State educational agency that receives a grant under subsection (c) shall use not less than 95 percent of the funds made available through the grant to make subgrants, on a competitive basis, to local educational agencies.
    - (2) Notice.—The State educational agency shall provide notice to all local educational agencies in the State of the availability of subgrants under this subsection and of the requirements for applying for the subgrants.
    - (3) LOCAL APPLICATIONS.—To be eligible to receive a subgrant under this section, a local educational agency shall submit an application to the State educational agency at such time, in such manner, and containing such information as the State educational agency may reasonably require.

1 (4) Use of subgrants.—A local educational 2 agency that receives a subgrant under this sub-3 section may use the funds made available through the subgrant to create a national digital school district by— 5 6 (A) acquiring technology; 7 (B) providing teacher mentoring; and 8 (C) carrying out other efforts to achieve 9 the purposes of this section. 10 ACADEMIC RESEARCH.—The Secretary shall award grants, on a competitive basis, for fiscal year 2004 11 12 to institutions of higher education, to conduct research on the effectiveness of the technology used in national digital 14 school districts. 15 (f) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—There are authorized to be appropriated such sums as may be 16 17 necessary to carry out this section. 18 SEC. 3. NATIONAL EVALUATION OF TECHNOLOGY PLANS. 19 Not later than 36 months after the date of enactment 20 of this Act, the Secretary, in consultation with other Fed-21 eral departments or agencies, State and local educational practitioners, and policy makers, including teachers, prin-23 cipals and superintendents, and experts in technology and the application of technology to education, shall report to

Congress on best practices in implementing technology ef-

- 1 fectively. The report shall include recommendations for the
- 2 purpose of establishing best practices that can be widely

3 implemented by State and local educational agencies.

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
