To amend the Bring Them Home Alive Act of 2000 to provide an asylum program with regard to American Persian Gulf War POW/MIAs, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

1	SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.					
2	This Act may be cited as the "Persian Gulf War					
3	POW/MIA Accountability Act of 2001".					
4	SEC. 2. AMERICAN PERSIAN GULF WAR POW/MIA ASYLUI					
5	PROGRAM.					
6	(a) Asylum Program.—The Bring Them Home					
7	Alive Act of 2000 (Public Law 106–484; 114 Stat. 2195;					
8	8 U.S.C. 1157 note) is amended by inserting after section					
9	3 the following new section:					
10	"SEC. 3A. AMERICAN PERSIAN GULF WAR POW/MIA ASYLUM					
11	PROGRAM.					
12	"(a) Asylum for Eligible Aliens.—Notwith-					
13	standing any other provision of law, the Attorney General					
14	shall grant refugee status in the United States to any alien					
15	described in subsection (b), upon the application of that					
16	alien.					
17	"(b) Eligibility.—Refugee status shall be granted					
18	under subsection (a) to—					
19	"(1) any alien who—					
20	"(A) is a national of Iraq or a nation of					
21	the Greater Middle East Region (as determined					
22	by the Attorney General in consultation with					
23	the Secretary of State); and					
24	"(B) personally delivers into the custody of					
25	the United States Government a living Amer-					

ican Persian Gulf War POW/MIA; and

1	"(2) any parent, spouse, or child of an alien de-			
2	scribed in paragraph (1).			
3	"(b) Eligibility.—			
4	"(1) In general.—Except as provided in para-			
5	graph (2), an alien described in this subsection is—			
6	"(A) any alien who—			
7	"(i) is a national of Iraq or a nation			
8	of the Greater Middle East Region (as de-			
9	termined by the Attorney General in con-			
10	sultation with the Secretary of State); and			
11	"(ii) personally delivers into the cus-			
12	tody of the United States Government a liv-			
13	ing American Persian Gulf War POW/MIA;			
14	and			
15	"(B) any parent, spouse, or child of an			
16	alien described in subparagraph (A).			
17	"(2) Exceptions.—An alien described in this			
18	subsection does not include a terrorist, a persecutor,			
19	a person who has been convicted of a serious criminal			
20	offense, or a person who presents a danger to the secu-			
21	rity of the United States, as set forth in clauses (i)			
22	through (v) of section $208(b)(2)(A)$ of the Immigra-			
23	tion and Nationality Act (8 U.S.C. 1158(b)(2)(A)).			
24	"(c) Definitions.—In this section:			

1	"(1) American persian gulf war pow/
2	MIA.—
3	"(A) IN GENERAL.—Except as provided in
4	subparagraph (B), the term 'American Persian
5	Gulf War POW/MIA' means an individual—
6	"(i) who is a member of a uniformed
7	service (within the meaning of section
8	101(3) of title 37, United States Code) in
9	a missing status (as defined in section
10	551(2) of such title and this subsection) as
11	a result of the Persian Gulf War, or any
12	successor conflict, operation, or action; or
13	"(ii) who is an employee (as defined
14	in section 5561(2) of title 5, United States
15	Code) in a missing status (as defined in
16	section 5561(5) of such title) as a result of
17	the Persian Gulf War, or any successor
18	conflict, operation, or action.
19	"(B) Exclusion.—Such term does not in-
20	clude an individual with respect to whom it is
21	officially determined under section 552(c) of
22	title 37, United States Code, that such indi-
23	vidual is officially absent from such individual's
24	post of duty without authority.

1	"(2) Missing status.—The term 'missing sta-					
2	tus', with respect to the Persian Gulf War, or any					
3	successor conflict, operation, or action, means the					
4	status of an individual as a result of the Persian					
5	Gulf War, or such conflict, operation, or action, i					
6	immediately before that status began the					
7	individual—					
8	"(A) was performing service in Kuwait,					
9	Iraq, or another nation of the Greater Middle					
10	East Region; or					
11	"(B) was performing service in the Greate					
12	Middle East Region in direct support of mili-					
13	tary operations in Kuwait or Iraq.					
14	"(3) Persian Gulf War.—The term 'Persian					
15	Gulf War' means the period beginning on August 2					
16	1990, and ending on the date thereafter prescribed					
17	by Presidential proclamation or by law.".					
18	(b) Broadcasting Information.—Section 4(a)(2)					
19	of that Act is amended—					
20	(1) by striking "and" at the end of subpara					
21	graph (A);					
22	(2) by striking the period at the end of sub-					
23	paragraph (B) and inserting "; and; and					
24	(3) by adding at the end the following new sub-					
25	paragraph:					

1	"(C) Iraq, Kuwait, or any other country of
2	the Greater Middle East Region (as determined
3	by the International Broadcasting Bureau in
4	consultation with the Attorney General and the
5	Secretary of State).".
