To amend the Richard B. Russell National School Lunch Act to exclude certain basic allowances for housing of a member of a uniformed service from the determination of eligibility for free and reduced price meals of a child of the member.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

1 **SECTION 1. EXCLUSION OF CERTAIN MILITARY BASIC AL-**
2 **LOWANCES FOR HOUSING FOR DETERMINA-**
3 **TION OF ELIGIBILITY FOR FREE AND RE-**
4 **DUCED PRICE MEALS.**

5 Section 9(b) of the Richard B. Russell National
6 School Lunch Act (42 U.S.C. 1758(b)) is amended by add-
7 ing at the end the following:

8 “(7) EXCLUSION OF CERTAIN MILITARY HOUS-
9 ING ALLOWANCES.—For the 2-year period beginning
10 on the date of enactment of this paragraph, the
11 amount of a basic allowance provided under section
12 403 of title 37, United States Code, on behalf of a
13 member of a uniformed service for housing that is
14 acquired or constructed under subchapter IV of
15 chapter 169 of title 10, United States Code, or any
16 related provision of law, shall not be considered to
17 be income for the purpose of determining the eligi-
18 bility of a child of the member for free or reduced
19 price lunches under this Act.”
