Mr. INOUE introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on the Judiciary

## A BILL

For the relief of Sung Jun Oh.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. PERMANENT RESIDENCE.**

4 Notwithstanding any other provision of law, for pur-  
5 poses of the Immigration and Nationality Act (8 U.S.C.  
6 1101 et seq.), Sung Jun Oh shall be held and considered  
7 to have been lawfully admitted to the United States for  
8 permanent residence as of the date of the enactment of  
9 this Act upon payment of any necessary visa fees.

10 **SEC. 2. REDUCTION OF NUMBER OF AVAILABLE VISAS.**

11 Upon the granting of permanent residence to Sung  
12 Jun Oh, as provided in this Act, the Secretary of State

1 shall instruct the proper officer to reduce by one number  
2 during the current fiscal year the total number of immi-  
3 grant visas available to natives of the country of the alien's  
4 birth under section 202(e) of the Immigration and Nation-  
5 ality Act (8 U.S.C. 1152(e)).
