A BILL

For the relief of Sung Jun Oh.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. PERMANENT RESIDENCE.
- 4 Notwithstanding any other provision of law, for pur-
- 5 poses of the Immigration and Nationality Act (8 U.S.C.
- 6 1101 et seq.), Sung Jun Oh shall be held and considered
- 7 to have been lawfully admitted to the United States for
- 8 permanent residence as of the date of the enactment of
- 9 this Act upon payment of any necessary visa fees.
- 10 SEC. 2. REDUCTION OF NUMBER OF AVAILABLE VISAS.
- 11 Upon the granting of permanent residence to Sung
- 12 Jun Oh, as provided in this Act, the Secretary of State

- 1 shall instruct the proper officer to reduce by one number
- 2 during the current fiscal year the total number of immi-
- 3 grant visas available to natives of the country of the alien's
- 4 birth under section 202(e) of the Immigration and Nation-

5 ality Act (8 U.S.C. 1152(e)).
