Mr. DURBIN introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on the Judiciary

A BILL

For the relief of J.L. Simmons Company, Inc., of
Champaign, Illinois.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SETTLEMENT OF CLAIM.**

4 (a) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary of the Treasury
5 shall pay J.L. Simmons Company, Inc., of Champaign, Il-
6 linois, out of any money in the Treasury not otherwise
7 appropriated, a sum of money, in an amount to be deter-
8 mined by the United States Court of Federal Claims, rep-
9 resenting the amount to which J.L. Simmons Company,
10 Inc., may be entitled in order to make J.L. Simmons Com-
11 pany, Inc., and any of its subcontractors, whole for any

1 litigation expenses, and any interest, due and owing to
2 J.L. Simmons Company, Inc., and any of its subcontractors,
3 and not otherwise recoverable at law, on account of
4 the construction of the Veterans Administration (West
5 Side) Hospital in Chicago, Illinois, during the period of
6 1949 through 1954, and the litigation of claims resulting
7 therefrom.

8 (b) FULL SATISFACTION OF CLAIMS.—The payment
9 made under subsection (a) shall be in full satisfaction of
10 all claims of J.L. Simmons, J.L. Simmons Company, Inc.,
11 or any of its subcontractors against the United States for
12 the expenses and interest described in that subsection.
