To provide for the use and distribution of the funds awarded to the Western Shoshone identifiable group under Indian Claims Commission Docket Numbers 326–A–1, 326–A–3, 326–K, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

2	This Act may be cited as the "Western Shoshone				
3	Claims Distribution Act".				
4	SEC. 2. DISTRIBUTION OF DOCKET 326-K FUNDS.				
5	The funds appropriated in satisfaction of the judg-				
6	ment award granted to the Western Shoshone Indians in				
7	Docket Number 326–K before the Indian Claims Commis-				
8	sion, including all earned interest, shall be distributed as				
9	follows:				
10	(1) The Secretary shall establish a Western				
11	Shoshone Judgment Roll consisting of all Western				
12	Shoshones who—				
13	(A) have at least 1/4 degree of Western				
14	Shoshone Blood;				
15	(B) are citizens of the United States; and				
16	(C) are living on the date of enactment of				
17	this Act.				
18	(2) Any individual determined or certified as el-				
19	igible by the Secretary to receive a per capita pay-				
20	ment from any other judgment fund awarded by the				
21	Indian Claims Commission, the United States				
22	Claims Court, or the United States Court of Federal				
23	Claims, that was appropriated on or before the date				
24	of enactment of this Act, shall not be eligible for en-				
25	rollment under this Act.				

- (3) The Secretary shall publish in the Federal Register rules and regulations governing the establishment of the Western Shoshone Judgment Roll and shall utilize any documents acceptable to the Secretary in establishing proof of eligibility. The Secretary's determination on all applications for enrollment under this paragraph shall be final.
 - (4) Upon completing the Western Shoshone Judgment Roll under paragraph (1), the Secretary shall make a per capita distribution of 100 percent of the funds described in this section, in a sum as equal as possible, to each person listed on the Roll.
 - (5)(A) With respect to the distribution of funds under this section, the per capita shares of living competent adults who have reached the age of 19 years on the date of the distribution provided for under paragraph (4), shall be paid directly to them.
 - (B) The per capita shares of deceased individuals shall be distributed to their heirs and legatees in accordance with regulations prescribed by the Secretary.
 - (C) The shares of legally incompetent individuals shall be administered pursuant to regulations and procedures established by the Secretary under

1 section 3(b)(3) of Public Law 93–134 (25 U.S.C. 1403(b)(3)).

(D) The shares of minors and individuals who are under the age of 19 years on the date of the distribution provided for under paragraph (4) shall be held by the Secretary in supervised individual Indian money accounts. The funds from such accounts shall be disbursed over a period of 4 years in payments equaling 25 percent of the principal, plus the interest earned on that portion of the per capita share. The first payment shall be disbursed to individuals who have reached the age of 18 years if such individuals are deemed legally competent. Subsequent payments shall be disbursed within 90 days of the individual's following 3 birthdays.

(6) All funds distributed under this Act are subject to the provisions of section 7 of Public Law 93–134 (25 U.S.C. 1407).

(7) All per capita shares belonging to living competent adults certified as eligible to share in the judgment fund distribution under this section, and the interest earned on those shares, that remain unpaid for a period of 6-years shall be added to the principal funds that are held and invested in accordance with section 3, except that in the case of a

- 1 minor, such 6-year period shall not begin to run
 2 until the minor reaches the age of majority.
- 3 (8) Any other residual principal and interest
 4 funds remaining after the distribution under para5 graph (4) is complete shall be added to the principal
 6 funds that are held and invested in accordance with
 7 section 3.
- 9 under this section shall not be construed as a waiver
 10 of any existing treaty rights pursuant to the "1863
 11 Treaty of Ruby Valley", inclusive of all Articles I
 12 through VIII, and shall not prevent any Western
 13 Shoshone Tribe or Band or individual Shoshone In14 dian from pursuing other rights guaranteed by law.

SEC. 3. DISTRIBUTION OF DOCKETS 326-A-1 AND 326-A-3.

- The funds appropriated in satisfaction of the judgment awards granted to the Western Shoshone Indians in

 Docket Numbers 326-A-1 and 326-A-3 before the

 United States Court of Claims, and the funds referred to
 under paragraphs (7) and (8) of section 2, together with
 all earned interest, shall be distributed as follows:
- 22 (1)(A) Not later than 120 days after the date
 23 of enactment of this Act, the Secretary shall estab24 lish in the Treasury of the United States a trust
 25 fund to be known as the "Western Shoshone Edu-

1	cational Trust Fund" for the benefit of the Western
2	Shoshone members. There shall be credited to the
3	Trust Fund the funds described in the matter pre-
4	ceding this paragraph.
5	(B) The principal in the Trust Fund shall not
6	be expended or disbursed. The Trust Fund shall be
7	invested as provided for in section 1 of the Act of
8	June 24, 1938 (25 U.S.C. 162a).
9	(C)(i) All accumulated and future interest and
10	income from the Trust Fund shall be distributed,
11	subject to clause (ii)—
12	(I) as educational grants and as other
13	forms of educational assistance determined
14	appropriate by the Administrative Com-
15	mittee established under paragraph (2) to
16	individual Western Shoshone members as
17	required under this Act; and
18	(II) to pay the reasonable and nec-
19	essary expenses of such Administrative
20	Committee (as defined in the written rules
21	and procedures of such Committee).
22	(ii) Funds shall not be distributed under this
23	paragraph on a per capita basis.
24	(2)(A) An Administrative Committee to oversee
25	the distribution of the educational grants and assist-

1	ance authorized under paragraph (1)(C) shall be es-
2	tablished as provided for in this paragraph.
3	(B) The Administrative Committee shall consist
4	of 1 representative from each of the following orga-
5	nizations:
6	(i) The Western Shoshone Te-Moak Tribe.
7	(ii) The Duckwater Shoshone Tribe.
8	(iii) The Yomba Shoshone Tribe.
9	(iv) The Ely Shoshone Tribe.
10	(v) The Western Shoshone Business Coun-
11	eil of the Duck Valley Reservation.
12	(vi) The Fallon Band of Western Sho-
13	shone.
14	(vii) The at large community.
15	(C) Each member of the Committee shall serve
16	for a term of 4 years. If a vacancy remains unfilled
17	in the membership of the Committee for a period in
18	excess of 60 days, the Committee shall appoint a re-
19	placement from among qualified members of the or-
20	ganization for which the replacement is being made
21	and such member shall serve until the organization
22	to be represented designates a replacement.
23	(D) The Secretary shall consult with the Com-
24	mittee on the management and investment of the
25	funds subject to distribution under this section.

(E) The Committee shall have the authority to disburse the accumulated interest fund under this Act in accordance with the terms of this Act. The Committee shall be responsible for ensuring that the funds provided through grants and assistance under paragraph (1)(C) are utilized in a manner consistent with the terms of this Act. In accordance with paragraph (1)(C)(i)(II), the Committee may use a portion of the interest funds to pay all of the reasonable and necessary expenses of the Committee, including per diem rates for attendance at meetings that are the same as those paid to Federal employees in the same geographic location.

(F) The Committee shall develop written rules and procedures that include such matters as operating procedures, rules of conduct, eligibility criteria for receipt of educational grants or assistance (such criteria to be consistent with this Act), application selection procedures, appeal procedures, fund disbursement procedures, and fund recoupment procedures. Such rules and procedures shall be subject to the approval of the Secretary. A portion of the interest funds in the Trust Fund, not to exceed \$100,000, may be used by the Committee to pay the expenses associated with developing such rules and

- procedures. At the discretion of the Committee, and
 with the approval of the appropriate tribal governing
 body, jurisdiction to hear appeals of the Committee's
 decisions may be exercised by a tribal court, or a
 court of Indian offenses operated under section 11
 of title 25, Code of Federal Regulations.
- 7 (G) The Committee shall employ an inde-8 pendent certified public accountant to prepare an 9 annual financial statement that includes the oper-10 ating expenses of the Committee and the total 11 amount of educational grants or assistance dis-12 bursed for the fiscal year for which the statement is 13 being prepared under this section. The Committee 14 shall compile a list of names of all individuals ap-15 proved to receive such grants or assistance during 16 such fiscal year. The financial statement and the list 17 shall be distributed to each organization represented 18 on the Committee and the Secretary and copies shall 19 be made available to the Western Shoshone members 20 upon request.

The financial statement and the list shall be distributed to each organization represented on the Committee and the Secretary and copies shall be made available to the Western Shoshone members upon request.
