CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

1 *Resolved by the Senate (the House of Representatives*
2 *concurring),*

3 **SECTION 1. AUTHORIZATION OF USE OF CAPITOL**
4 **GROUNDS FOR NATIONAL BOOK FESTIVAL.**

5 (a) **IN GENERAL.**—The Library of Congress (in this
6 resolution referred to as the ‘sponsor’), in cooperation with
7 the First Lady, may sponsor the National Book Festival
8 (in this resolution referred to as the ‘event’) on the Capitol
9 Grounds.

10 (b) **DATE OF EVENT.**—The event shall be held on
11 September 8, 2001, or on such other date as the Senate
12 Committee on Rules and Administration and the Speaker
13 of the House of Representatives jointly designate.

1 **SEC. 2. TERMS AND CONDITIONS.**

2 (a) IN GENERAL.—Under conditions to be prescribed
3 by the Architect of the Capitol and the Capitol Police
4 Board, the event authorized under section 1 shall be—

5 (1) free of admission charge and open to the
6 public; and

7 (2) arranged not to interfere with the needs of
8 Congress.

9 (b) EXPENSES AND LIABILITIES.—The sponsor shall
10 assume full responsibility for all expenses and liabilities
11 incident to all activities associated with the event.

12 **SEC. 3. EVENT PREPARATIONS.**

13 (a) STRUCTURES AND EQUIPMENT.—Subject to the
14 approval of the Architect of the Capitol, the sponsor may
15 cause to be placed on the Capitol Grounds such stage,
16 seating, booths, sound amplification and video devices, and
17 other related structures and equipment as may be required
18 for the event, including equipment for the broadcast of
19 the event over radio, television, and other media outlets.

20 (b) ADDITIONAL ARRANGEMENTS.—The Architect of
21 the Capitol and the Capitol Police Board may make any
22 additional arrangements as may be required to carry out
23 the event.

24 **SEC. 4. ENFORCEMENT OF RESTRICTIONS.**

25 The Capitol Police Board shall provide for enforce-
26 ment of the restrictions contained in section 4 of the Act

1 of July 31, 1946 (40 U.S.C. 193d; 60 Stat. 718), con-
2 cerning sales, displays, advertisements, and solicitations
3 on the Capitol Grounds, as well as other restrictions appli-
4 cable to the Capitol Grounds in connection with the event.
