CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

Directing the Architect of the Capitol to enter into a contract for the design and construction of a monument to commemorate the contributions of minority women to women's suffrage and to the participation of minority women in public life, and for other purposes.

1	SECTION 1. DESIGN AND CONSTRUCTION OF MONUMENT
2	COMMEMORATING CONTRIBUTIONS OF MI-
3	NORITY WOMEN TO WOMEN'S SUFFRAGE.
4	(a) In General.—Not later than 1 year after the
5	date of adoption of this Resolution, the Architect of the
6	Capitol shall enter into a contract for the design and con-
7	struction of a monument to commemorate the contribu-
8	tions of minority women to women's suffrage and to the
9	participation of minority women in public life in the
10	United States (referred to in this Resolution as the
11	"Monument").
12	(b) Women Depicted on Monument.—The Monu-
13	ment shall depict an appropriate representative, as deter-
14	mined by the Advisory Committee established under sec-
15	tion 2, of each of the following:
16	(1) African American women.
17	(2) Hispanic American women.
18	(3) Asian Pacific American women.
19	(4) Jewish American women.
20	(5) Native American women.
21	(c) Deadline for Completion.—The contract
22	under subsection (a) shall include a requirement that the
23	Monument be completed and delivered to the Architect of
24	the Capitol not later than 18 months after the date on
25	which the Architect enters into the contract.

1	(d) Location.—The Architect of the Capitol shall
2	arrange for the Monument to be placed in a prominent
3	location of the Capitol.
4	SEC. 2. ADVISORY COMMITTEE.
5	(a) In General.—An Advisory Committee shall be
6	established to—
7	(1) solicit from the general public nominees for
8	depiction on the Monument; and
9	(2) recommend to the Architect of the Capitol,
10	for depiction on the Monument, individuals that are
11	representative of the women specified in section
12	2(b).
13	(b) Composition.—The Advisory Committee shall be
14	composed of 5 members, of whom—
15	(1) 1 member shall be appointed by the Speak-
16	er of the House of Representatives;
17	(2) 1 member shall be appointed by the minor-
18	ity leader of the House of Representatives;
19	(3) 1 member shall be appointed by the major-
20	ity leader of the Senate;
21	(4) 1 member shall be appointed by the minor-
22	ity leader of the Senate; and
23	(5) 1 member shall be appointed by the Presi-
24	dent Pro Tempore of the Senate.

- 1 (c) APPOINTMENT.—Not later than 30 days after the
- 2 adoption of this Resolution, members of the Advisory
- 3 Committee shall be appointed in accordance with sub-
- 4 section (b).
- 5 (d) Compensation.—A member of the Advisory
- 6 Committee shall serve without pay.
- 7 (e) Deadline for Submission.—Not later than 90
- 8 days after the date of the adoption of this Resolution, the
- 9 Advisory Committee shall submit to the Architect of the
- 10 Capitol the names of the individuals to be depicted on the
- 11 Monument.
- 12 SEC. 3. AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.
- There are authorized to be appropriated such sums
- 14 as are necessary to carry out this Resolution (including
- 15 sums as are necessary for the Advisory Committee to carry
- 16 out the duties described in section 2), to remain available
- 17 until expended.
