Mr. BENNETT (for himself, Mr. HATCH, Mr. DODD, Mr. McCONNELL, and Mr. STEVENS) submitted the following concurrent resolution; which was considered and agreed to

CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

Authorizing the 2002 Winter Olympics Torch Relay to come onto the Capitol Grounds.

1 *Resolved by the Senate (the House of Representatives*
2 *concurring),*

3 **SECTION 1. AUTHORIZATION OF THE RUNNING OF 2002**
4 **WINTER OLYMPICS TORCH RELAY ONTO THE**
5 **CAPITOL GROUNDS.**

6 On December 21, 2001, or on such other date as the
7 Speaker of the House of Representatives and the Com-
8 mittee on Rules and Administration of the Senate may
9 jointly designate, the 2002 Winter Olympics Torch Relay
10 (in this resolution referred to as the “event”) may come

1 onto the Capitol Grounds as part of the ceremony of the
2 2002 Winter Olympic Games to be held in Salt Lake City,
3 Utah.

4 **SEC. 2. RESPONSIBILITY OF CAPITOL POLICE BOARD.**

5 The Capitol Police Board shall take such actions as
6 may be necessary to carry out the event.

7 **SEC. 3. CONDITIONS RELATING TO PHYSICAL PREPARA-**
8 **TIONS.**

9 The Architect of the Capitol may prescribe conditions
10 for physical preparations for the event.

11 **SEC. 4. ENFORCEMENT OF RESTRICTIONS.**

12 The Capitol Police Board shall provide for enforce-
13 ment of the restrictions contained in section 4 of the Act
14 of July 31, 1946 (40 U.S.C. 193d; 60 Stat. 718), con-
15 cerning sales, advertisements, displays, and solicitations
16 on the Capitol Grounds, as well as other restrictions appli-
17 cable to the Capitol Grounds, with respect to the event.

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
