CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

Providing for a National Day of Reconciliation.

1	Resolved by the Senate (the House of Representatives
2	concurring),
3	SECTION 1. USE OF ROTUNDA OF THE CAPITOL.
4	The rotunda of the Capitol is authorized to be used
5	at any time on November 27, 2001, or December 4, 2001,
6	for a National Day of Reconciliation where—
7	(1) the 2 Houses of Congress shall assemble in
8	the rotunda with the Chaplain of the House of Rep-
9	resentatives and the Chaplain of the Senate in at-
10	tendance; and
11	(2) during this assembly, the Members of the 2

Houses may gather to humbly seek the blessings of

1	Providence for forgiveness, reconciliation, unity, and
2	charity for all people of the United States, thereby
3	assisting the Nation to realize its potential as—
4	(A) the champion of hope;
5	(B) the vindicator of the defenseless; and
6	(C) the guardian of freedom.
7	SEC. 2. PHYSICAL PREPARATIONS FOR THE ASSEMBLY.
8	Physical preparations for the assembly shall be car-
9	ried out in accordance with such conditions as the Archi-
10	tect of the Capitol may prescribe.
