## JOINT RESOLUTION

Designating September 11 as “National Day of  
Remembrance”.

1       *Resolved by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2       *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3       **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4       This Act may be cited as the “National Day of Re-  
5       membrance Act of 2001”.

6       **SEC. 2. NATIONAL DAY OF REMEMBRANCE.**

7       (a) DESIGNATION.—September 11 is National Day of  
8       Remembrance.

9       (b) PROCLAMATION.—The President is requested to  
10      issue each year a proclamation—

1           (1) remembering those who tragically lost their  
2       lives as a result of the terrorist attacks on the  
3       United States on September 11, 2001, and honoring  
4       the police, firefighters, and emergency personnel who  
5       responded with such valor on September 11, 2001;

6           (2) calling on United States Government offi-  
7       cials to display the flag of the United States at half  
8       mast on National Day of Remembrance in honor of  
9       those who lost their lives as a result of the terrorist  
10      attacks on the United States on September 11,  
11      2001;

12          (3) inviting State and local governments and  
13      the people of the United States to observe National  
14      Day of Remembrance with appropriate ceremonies;  
15      and

16          (4) urging all people of the United States to ob-  
17      serve a moment of silence on National Day of Re-  
18      membrance in honor of those who lost their lives as  
19      a result of the terrorist attacks on the United States  
20      on September 11, 2001.
