

JOINT RESOLUTION

Designating September 11 as “National Day of Remembrance”.

1 *Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives*
2 *of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “National Day of Re-
5 membrance Act of 2001”.

6 **SEC. 2. NATIONAL DAY OF REMEMBRANCE.**

7 (a) DESIGNATION.—September 11 is National Day of
8 Remembrance.

9 (b) PROCLAMATION.—The President is requested to
10 issue each year a proclamation—

11 (1) remembering those who tragically lost their
12 lives as a result of the terrorist attacks on the
13 United States on September 11, 2001, and honoring
14 the police, firefighters, and emergency personnel who
15 responded with such valor on September 11, 2001;

16 (2) calling on United States Government offi-
17 cials to display the flag of the United States at half

1 mast on National Day of Remembrance in honor of
2 those who lost their lives as a result of the terrorist
3 attacks on the United States on September 11,
4 2001;

5 (3) inviting State and local governments and
6 the people of the United States to observe National
7 Day of Remembrance with appropriate ceremonies;
8 and

9 (4) urging all people of the United States to ob-
10 serve a moment of silence on National Day of Re-
11 membrance in honor of those who lost their lives as
12 a result of the terrorist attacks on the United States
13 on September 11, 2001.
