## CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

1        *Resolved by the House of Representatives (the Senate*  
2   *concurring),*

1 **SECTION 1. USE OF CAPITOL GROUNDS FOR NATIONAL**  
2 **PEACE OFFICERS' MEMORIAL SERVICE.**

3 (a) IN GENERAL.—The National Fraternal Order of  
4 Police and its auxiliary (in this resolution referred to as  
5 the “sponsor”) shall be permitted to sponsor a public  
6 event, the 22nd annual National Peace Officers’ Memorial  
7 Service (in this resolution jointly referred to as the  
8 “event”), on the Capitol Grounds, in order to honor the  
9 law enforcement officers who died in the line of duty dur-  
10 ing 2002.

11 (b) DATE OF EVENT.—The event shall be held on  
12 May 15, 2003, or on such other date as the Speaker of  
13 the House of Representatives and the Committee on Rules  
14 and Administration of the Senate jointly designate.

15 **SEC. 2. TERMS AND CONDITIONS.**

16 (a) IN GENERAL.—Under conditions to be prescribed  
17 by the Architect of the Capitol and the Capitol Police  
18 Board, the event shall be—

19 (1) free of admission charge and open to the  
20 public; and

21 (2) arranged not to interfere with the needs of  
22 Congress.

23 (b) EXPENSES AND LIABILITIES.—The sponsor shall  
24 assume full responsibility for all expenses and liabilities  
25 incident to all activities associated with the event.

1   **SEC. 3. EVENT PREPARATIONS.**

2           Subject to the approval of the Architect of the Cap-  
3   itol, the sponsor is authorized to erect upon the Capitol  
4   Grounds such stage, sound amplification devices, and  
5   other related structures and equipment, as may be re-  
6   quired for the event.

7   **SEC. 4. ENFORCEMENT OF RESTRICTIONS.**

8           The Capitol Police Board shall provide for enforce-  
9   ment of the restrictions contained in section 4 of the Act  
10   of July 31, 1946 (40 U.S.C. 193d; 60 Stat. 718), con-  
11   cerning sales, advertisements, displays, and solicitations  
12   on the Capitol Grounds, as well as other restrictions appli-  
13   cable to the Capitol Grounds, in connection with the event.
