Mr. LATOURETTE (for himself, Ms. NORTON, and Mr. ROGERS of Kentucky)
submitted the following concurrent resolution; which was referred to the
Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure

CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

Authorizing the use of the Capitol Grounds for the National
Peace Officers’ Memorial Service.

1 *Resolved by the House of Representatives (the Senate*
2 *concurring),*

3 **SECTION 1. USE OF CAPITOL GROUNDS FOR NATIONAL**
4 **PEACE OFFICERS’ MEMORIAL SERVICE.**

5 (a) IN GENERAL.—The National Fraternal Order of
6 Police and its auxiliary (in this resolution referred to as
7 the “sponsor”) shall be permitted to sponsor a public
8 event, the 22nd annual National Peace Officers’ Memorial
9 Service (in this resolution jointly referred to as the
10 “event”), on the Capitol Grounds, in order to honor the

1 law enforcement officers who died in the line of duty dur-
2 ing 2002.

3 (b) DATE OF EVENT.—The event shall be held on
4 May 15, 2003, or on such other date as the Speaker of
5 the House of Representatives and the Committee on Rules
6 and Administration of the Senate jointly designate.

7 **SEC. 2. TERMS AND CONDITIONS.**

8 (a) IN GENERAL.—Under conditions to be prescribed
9 by the Architect of the Capitol and the Capitol Police
10 Board, the event shall be—

11 (1) free of admission charge and open to the
12 public; and

13 (2) arranged not to interfere with the needs of
14 Congress.

15 (b) EXPENSES AND LIABILITIES.—The sponsor shall
16 assume full responsibility for all expenses and liabilities
17 incident to all activities associated with the event.

18 **SEC. 3. EVENT PREPARATIONS.**

19 Subject to the approval of the Architect of the Cap-
20 itol, the sponsor is authorized to erect upon the Capitol
21 Grounds such stage, sound amplification devices, and
22 other related structures and equipment, as may be re-
23 quired for the event.

1 **SEC. 4. ENFORCEMENT OF RESTRICTIONS.**

2 The Capitol Police Board shall provide for enforce-
3 ment of the restrictions contained in section 4 of the Act
4 of July 31, 1946 (40 U.S.C. 193d; 60 Stat. 718), con-
5 cerning sales, advertisements, displays, and solicitations
6 on the Capitol Grounds, as well as other restrictions appli-
7 cable to the Capitol Grounds, in connection with the event.
