4 **SECTION 1. CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT.**

5 The following article is proposed as an amendment
6 to the Constitution of the United States, which shall be
7 valid to all intents and purposes as part of the Constitu-

1 tion when ratified by the legislatures of three-fourths of
2 the several States:

3 “ARTICLE —

4 “A person who has been a citizen of the United
5 States for at least 20 years shall be eligible to hold the
6 Office of President.”.
