and rescissions) in the attachments to Office of Management and Budget Bulletin No. 03–05 entitled 'Apportionment of the Continuing Resolution(s) for Fiscal Year
2004'.".

": Provided, That such amounts as may be necessary for 10 11 administrative expenses of the Grants-in-aid for Airports 12 program shall be available to the Secretary of Transpor-13 tation out of the Airport and Airway Trust Fund at a rate for operations not exceeding the current rate and for 14 15 which authority was made available under the Department of Transportation and Related Agencies Appropriations 16 Act, 2003". 17
