## A BILL

To expedite the granting of posthumous citizenship to members of the United States Armed Forces.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

SECTION 1. GRANTING OF POSTHUMOUS CITIZENSHIP TO

MEMBERS OF THE ARMED FORCES.

(a) REQUESTS AND DOCUMENTATION FOR POSTHUMOUS CITIZENSHIP.—Section 329A of the Immigration
and Nationality Act (8 U.S.C. 1440-1) is amended—

(1) by striking subsection (c) and inserting the

- 1 "(c) Requests for Posthumous Citizenship.—A
- 2 request for the granting of posthumous citizenship to a
- 3 person described in subsection (b) shall be filed on behalf
- 4 of that person by the Secretary of Defense or the Sec-
- 5 retary's designee with the Bureau of Citizenship and Im-
- 6 migration Services in the Department of Homeland Secu-
- 7 rity immediately upon the death of that person."; and
- 8 (2) by striking subsection (d) and inserting the

- 10 "(d) Documentation of Posthumous Citizen-
- 11 SHIP.—If the Director of the Bureau of Citizenship and
- 12 Immigration Services approves the request referred to in
- 13 subsection (c), the Director shall send to the next-of-kin
- 14 of the person who is granted citizenship, a suitable docu-
- 15 ment which states that the United States considers the
- 16 person to have been a citizen of the United States at the
- 17 time of the person's death.".
