4	(a) Income Disregard.—Section 1612(b) of the So-
5	cial Security Act (42 U.S.C. 1382a(b)) is amended—
6	(1) by striking "and" at the end of paragraph
7	(21);
8	(2) by striking the period at the end of para-
9	graph (22) and inserting "; and"; and
10	(3) by adding at the end the following:
11	"(23) any annuity paid by a State to the indi-
12	vidual (or such spouse) on the basis of the individ-
13	ual's being a veteran (as defined in section 101 of
14	title 38, United States Code) and blind, if a law of
15	such State providing for such an annuity was in ef-

24	(3) by inserting after paragraph (13) the fol-

"(14) for the month of receipt and every month 1 2 thereafter, any annuity paid by a State to the indi-3 vidual (or such spouse) on the basis of the individual's being a veteran (as defined in section 101 of 4 5 title 38, United States Code) and blind, if a law of such State providing for such an annuity was in ef-6 7 fect on the date of the enactment of this paragraph.". 8

9 (c) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendments made by 10 this section shall apply to benefits paid for months begin-11 ning after the date of the enactment of this Act.
