- 3 SECTION 1. DESIGNATION OF NATIONAL TREE.
- 4 (a) Designation.—Chapter 3 of title 36, United
- 5 States Code, is amended by adding at the end the fol-
- 6 lowing:
- 7 "§ 305. National tree
- 8 "The tree genus Quercus, commonly known as the
- 9 oak tree, is the national tree.".

1	(b) Conforming Amendments.—Such title is
2	amended—
3	(1) in the table of contents for part A of sub-
4	title I, by striking ", and March" and inserting
5	"March, and Tree";
6	(2) in the chapter heading for chapter 3, by
7	striking ", AND MARCH" and inserting "MARCH,
8	AND TREE"; and
9	(3) in the table of sections for chapter 3, by
10	adding at the end the following:
	"305. National tree.".
